Board Corner

Living Life at SCA: What it Takes

The Facilities and Landscaping Department



The last few Board Corner articles have taken you on a tour of our services and amenities so you can see what it takes to make SCA a premier community, and how your HOA dues contribute to the lifestyle available to residents. We want to share what it takes to keep this community in the condition we've grown to expect and how our 59 full-time and 51 part-time staff and more than 600 volunteers support the sense of community we all enjoy.

This month we are focusing on our Facilities Department headed by Shawn Evans, who has worked at SCA since 2016. This department is the largest in SCA with 28 full-time employees. The department includes housekeeping, maintenance, pool technicians, a painter, and landscape employees who maintain a small nursery. The department cleans and maintains the 130,000 square feet of space in our three community centers, our sports courts, pools, and over 140 acres of landscape within SCA.

Each month the department completes an average of 400 work orders. They perform routine maintenance and coordinate with various vendors who perform more specialized work and inspections. Some vendors are contracted for large-scale projects, but participation and oversight by our facilities managers are key.

Last year major initiatives included removal of turf and replacement with xeriscape landscaping. This resulted in eight million gallons of water and maintenance costs saved. Combined over the last five years, water savings have been nearly 200 million gallons. In February, the Henderson City Council awarded SCA the "City of Henderson 2023 Water Conservation Award". (See Chief Operating Officer Report). The Facilities Department prides itself on being proactive and using technology to be more efficient. Many systems, such as thermostats and water temperature, can now be managed from smart phones.

The Facilities and Landscape Governance Committee is comprised of homeowners who volunteer to assist the Board of Directors, the Facilities Department, and the community. The committee assists with various initiatives such as GIS (geographic information system) mapping, block wall maintenance and repair, and space utilization. The Facilities and Landscape Committee partnered with the Finance Governance Committee on our updated Reserve Study, a copy of which is available on our website. The study lists the thousands of components that must be maintained and replaced.

Our buildings serve as a gathering place for the community. So, the next time you walk into one of our centers, pause a minute and think about what it takes to keep everything clean and in working order. It's a 24-hour, seven day a week operation, and we appreciate the staff and the volunteers who support them.



Chief Operating Officer Report



Water Savings Is Its Own Reward



Each year, the City of Henderson honors one Henderson resident or business that has made significant contributions to water conservation within the community in the previous year.

For 2023, the envelope please. And the winner is...Sun City Anthem!

The city's Water Conservation Department created this award in 2022. It recognizes outstanding achievements in, among other things,

water-efficient landscape redesign, renewable water policies and practices, and environmental stewardship.

The Anthem Country Club won the inaugural award by saving approximately 60 million gallons of water through turf conversion methods like grass removal and use of artificial turf.

Board members and Management recently received this prestigious award during the February Henderson City Council meeting.

Last year's major initiatives included removal of turf and replacement with xeriscape landscaping. This resulted in eight million gallons of water and maintenance costs saved. Combined over the last five years, water savings have been nearly 200 million gallons.

Since 2018, Board policy has been to replace non-functional grass areas on SCA-maintained properties with drought-tolerant landscaping native to the Mojave Desert. Notable projects recently completed in 2023 were the East Lawn (53,000 sq. ft. of grass), Hampton Road (more than 1 mile of streetscape was relandscaped), and the entrance to Pinnacle (16,000 sq. ft. removed). This was crucial for several reasons. First and foremost, the Mojave Desert's native plants are well-adapted to

the region's arid climate, requiring significantly less water and maintenance than non-native alternatives.

Moreover, reducing water usage aligns with environmental stewardship, helping mitigate the impact of water scarcity and drought conditions. We are all too familiar with the level of water at Lake Mead, the valley's main source of water. This proactive approach not only benefits the community but also sets an example for responsible water management and fosters a sense of environmental awareness among residents.

Over the past five years, SCA has saved nearly 200 million gallons of water. To put that in perspective, if you were standing in the middle of a football field, 200 million gallons of water would be 600' above your head. You would literally be crushed under the water weight. (1 gallon = 8 lbs. x 200 million gallons = 1.6 billion gallons of water weight.) Believe it or not, our conservation efforts are just a drop in a bucket as 200 million gallons is one day's worth of water that is returned to Lake Mead from the surrounding communities.

By embracing these water-efficient landscaping options, using water-smart controllers and replacing more than 800 valves with next-generation ones, SCA is at the forefront of water conservation in the valley. Countless other organizations, like the Southern Nevada Water Authority, the City of Henderson, and HOAs, large and small, have toured SCA to see how efficient our water conservation systems are. They were impressed, to say the least.

Ultimately, the shift to drought-tolerant landscaping throughout the valley not only conserves water but also establishes a more resilient and eco-friendlier environment in harmony with the natural characteristics of the Mojave Desert. By working alongside Mother Nature, SCA's 2024 goal is a 60% water usage savings (overall since this program started in 2018).

Committee Reports

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW

Plan review: second and fourth Thursdays, 9 to 10:30 a.m. Emerson/Franklin Rooms, **NO IN-PERSON ATTENDANCE** because plan information shared is confidential. Applicants must be available by phone.

Topic of the Month: Who is responsible for interpreting the intent of specific Design Guidelines clauses?

Answer: "On behalf of the Board of Directors, the ARC and Sub-ARC are responsible for reviewing plans and specifications, interpreting these Design Guidelines, and making decisions to approve, approve with conditions, or disapprove all projects. The ARC and Sub-ARC may consult with the Community Standards Department during the review process." (From paragraph I.B. item 2 on page 6 of 49 of the Design Guidelines)

Discussion: Assigning this responsibility to the ARC and Sub-ARC personnel makes perfect sense. These members are constantly reviewing homeowner's applications for approval to get work done and must constantly study the clauses particular to the request at hand to make sure the proposed work is compliant. Many have been doing this work for years at Sun City Anthem. I believe that the overall knowledge of the Design Guidelines within the personnel of the ARC and Sub-ARC organizations is hard to match among all homeowners and even SCA staff. The only exceptions could possibly be for ARC members or the personnel of the Community Standards Department who use the Design Guidelines almost daily.

It would be impossible for disputes on specific clauses to be negotiated between homeowners and ARC members. The ARC and Sub-ARC members come from a position of historical knowledge regarding the intent of the clauses, with a goal of maintaining the quality and consistency of our community. There can only be one function given that responsibility, and the ARC and the Sub-ARC are the natural choices.

Friendly advice from the ARC Subcommittee 2024 Chairman. Remember to READ THE BOOK (the Current Design Guidelines) – it will save you time and make the approval process run smoothly.

COVENANTS

The Board of Directors, as required in Article 5.2 of the Bylaws, established a Deed Restriction Enforcement Committee. At Sun City Anthem, this committee is called Covenants.

The Covenants Committee is the hearing tribunal of the Association and conducts hearings pursuant to Section 3.26 of the Bylaws and Article 7.4 of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions.

Hearings are normally scheduled once a month. Should you have any questions, please contact **Compliance@SCACAI.com**. A hearing is scheduled when a case cannot be resolved during the enforcement process.

The Covenants Committee hearing tribunal reviews the information regarding an alleged violation and determines whether a violation of the standards set forth in the Governing Documents occurred. This committee is responsible for imposing fines and/or sanctions. Following a hearing before the Covenants Committee, the alleged violator has the right to appeal the decision to the Board. Covenants meetings are not open to residents unless invited.

March will be a significant milestone for SCA financial management. Theresa Gaudet departs as CFO, and long-time Finance Committee members Andrew Muha and Michael Quinn step down after eight and six years community service, respectively. We want to thank Theresa for her hard work and dedication guiding SCA through challenging economic times and for improvements to our financial practices, such as increased emphasis on investment income, streamlining the budget and reserve process, and positive annual audit performances. At *Spirit* publication deadline, SCA was in the final throes of interviewing candidates for her replacement. Stay tuned.

Here's an update on many topics of financial interest to our homeowners:

- The new, outside audit team, Frazier & Deeter, are already neck-deep into the 2023 audit. They are extremely professional and working well with SCA Management.
- Rumors of increased tax exposure on a year-end operating

- Rumors of the need to increase our Reserve Fully Funded Balance Percent to 90 - 100% are simply wrong. SCA's Reserve is healthy and sufficient for any contingency short of the legal definition of an "Act of God". How much of your personal money do you want sitting in SCA's Reserve account rather than in your own wallet?
- Rumors that Yorktown Grill overruns will bankrupt our Association are misguided. Thanks to the positive support of our residents, financial performance of this start-up operation is proceeding as expected. SCA continues to make adjustments to better serve the community and appreciates all your feedback on meals and service. If you want to help ensure the restaurant's success, drop in for Happy Hour and stay to sample the daily special for supper!
- Of real concern to the FC is the three-year impact of inflation on day-to-day costs (~18%), the nationwide increase in insurance premiums due to so many natural disasters, and the soaring cost of utilities. On a positive note, we actually forecast a decline in natural gas prices by mid-2024, which should also help lower electricity costs, as much of Nevada's electric power is generated by natural gas utility plants.

With Andrew and Michael's departure, the Finance Committee really needs a few more good men and women to get the job done. Our mission is to advise and assist Management and the Board Treasurer in successfully performing their duties. We conduct monthly reviews of SCA finances, undertake economic studies, and make recommendations on financial policies and reports presented to the SCA Board of Directors.

Our monthly meetings are open to the public, where a current SCA financial update is presented by Management prior to its submission to the Board. Residents are encouraged to attend these meetings in order to better understand the financial operations of the community. This is also the best time and place to ask detailed questions about SCA's financial activities.

Addressing Speeding In Anthem

Driving Anthem Parkway can sometimes seem like you're in a road race when some drivers go zipping by you, ignoring the speed limit, and haphazardly weaving in and out of traffic. Naturally, the SCA Board of Directors is quite concerned about it.

Captain Anthony Branchini, who oversees the Central Area Command in Anthem, recently sent the *Spirit* this article where he addresses this issue.

"I am outlining Henderson Police Department's and the City's efforts to address the issue of speeders in the Anthem area. As the area commander and resident myself, I understand the concern, which is why I have asked my squads to conduct traffic enforcement in that area when possible. From a department standpoint, we have also had our traffic officers and problemsolving unit increase traffic enforcement in and around the Anthem area to include the Anthem loop and Eastern corridor. Our traffic unit has also placed speed trailers in the area which allows us to obtain a time/date of when most speeding occurs, so we can ensure resources are utilized most efficiently.

By utilizing new technology, my officers are also working to identify reckless/aggressive drivers in our area by sending a letter to the registered owners letting them know someone driving their vehicle has been identified as driving recklessly/ aggressively. I started this pilot program in August 2023. Since then, we have sent about 120 letters, mostly to residents of Henderson. I have seen a slight decrease in the number of reckless drivers since I began this program. When Metro began this program in their Enterprise Command, they saw a 50% decrease within a year, so I hope to see similar results.

The Henderson Public Works Department has conducted speed assessments on Hampton Road and has noticed a speed concern going both eastbound and westbound along that approximate two-mile stretch of roadway. If you drive east up Hampton Road, you'll notice a speed radar on the shoulder, notifying drivers of the 30 mph limit. They are also currently conducting a speed assessment on the Anthem loop to best identify where the speeders might be and what efforts can be made to mitigate them.

The topic of speeding is something I not only hear about, but also see it when I drive in the area. I often speak about it at the neighborhood watch meetings, and it will be a subtopic at the April 18 Citizen's Traffic Advisory Board meeting taking place in the Henderson City Council Chambers Conference Room. You are free to attend the meeting, which starts at 6 p.m.

Although there are no quick solutions to catching speeders in our area, we are very aware of the Anthem residents' concerns and are taking steps to try to reduce it. The police department and the city can only do so much, which is why it also takes the public to stay educated on the dangers of speeding and to remind their friends and family to drive responsibly in our area."

SNWA Offering Larger Cash-for-Grass Incentives



Calling all homeowners! The residential Water Smart Landscape Rebate has been temporarily increased from \$3 to \$5 per square foot of grass upgraded to water-efficient landscaping. The rebate for business, HOA, and multifamily properties remains \$3 per square foot, and will decrease to \$2 per square foot Jan. 1, 2025. Take advantage while the offer lasts.

Spring into action this season by trading your grass for cash with the Southern Nevada Water Authority's (SNWA) biggest incentive ever. The SNWA has temporarily increased the Water Smart Landscape Rebate (WSLR) for homeowners from \$3 to \$5 per square foot of grass upgraded to water-efficient landscaping for the rest of 2024.

Qualifying homeowners will receive \$5 for each square foot of grass they convert (up to the first 10,000 square feet) to dripirrigated, desert-adapted plants and trees, and \$3.50 for each additional square foot. Conversions must be completed by the end of 2024 to receive the increased incentive.

Businesses, municipalities, community associations, and multi-family properties remain eligible for the current \$3 per square foot incentive, which will decrease to \$2 per square foot for nonfunctional, decorative grass beginning in 2025.

Outdoor landscaping is the biggest user of Southern Nevada's limited water supply. By converting to a Water Smart landscape, you'll use 55 gallons of water less per square foot than thirsty-grass landscapes.

While it can seem daunting to consider removing your home's grass, embracing a lawn-free landscape not only conserves water but also reduces maintenance efforts, allowing for a more sustainable and vibrant outdoor space. Here are some common myths associated with water-smart landscapes:

"Water Smart Landscaping will make my house hotter."

• Shade is the key to keeping you cool in the desert. Grass feels cool because so much water is evaporating from it. There are dozens of water-efficient trees and plants that can be used to shade south and west exposure from our relentless desert sun, while using less water; consult the Plant Search Tool on **SNWA.com** to find what works best for you. Also, as part of the WSL rebate, the Tree Enhancement Program offers \$100 bonuses to new participants for each qualifying tree planted during landscape conversions. It's a shady deal you will want to take advantage of, providing much-needed shade against the urban heat island effect.

"It takes too long for water-efficient plants to mature and achieve SNWA's required 50% canopy."

• You can save money on labor and plant material costs by planting smaller sized plants. It doesn't matter if you install a one-gallon or a five-gallon plant; the SNWA will give you the same maturity credit. And most plants when watered properly—fill in or grow quickly.

"All desert plants and rocks are ugly."

• Water-smart landscaping is so much more than rocks and cacti. With over 500 plant options that are resilient enough to tolerate our harsh environment and soil conditions, coupled with thoughtful design and selection, achieving a beautiful landscape while conserving water is possible.

As we enter spring, it's also time to change your watering clock. Seasonal watering restrictions are in effect March 1 through April 30, and limits landscape watering to up to **three assigned days per week** (Sunday watering is prohibited all year). You can increase your savings without harming your landscape by slowly "ramping up" irrigation schedules, adding the second and third watering days only as temperatures warm up and weather patterns permit. If you have plants and trees on drip systems, they require significantly less water, typically needing to be watered every one to two days in spring.

Spring is a great time to upgrade your grass to a beautiful water-efficient landscape! To apply for the WSL program, and for program conditions and criteria visit **SNWA.com**.

SCA supports the removal of grass and the installation of desert landscaping for each home in our community. It is the goal of SCA to save even more water this year. With these rebates from SNWA this is the time to cut your maintenance and water bill by installing desert landscaping and artificial grass. Remember to submit plans with the Architectural Review Committee at **ARC-Committee@scacai.com** for any changes to the front yard; however, no approval is needed for the rear yard.

Emergency Preparedness

Let's Talk



Most of us grew up with hard-wired, dial-up "landlines" as pretty much the only form of communication to talk to friends, family, co-workers, etc. Landlines provided reliability because they did not require a power source and did not transmit voice conversations via air waves.

Over the years, many landline devices have been augmented or simply replaced by cellphones. While cellphones are more portable, convenient, and offer both voice and messaging communication, they are not without faults. History has shown that when a major event occurs, cellphone networks are either physically impacted by the event, or the massive numbers of callers trying to initiate or receive a call crashes the network capability. Given SCA cellphone reception is already sketchy should a major event occur, communications may be even more impacted. If this were to happen, what is your plan to receive information and communicate with your families and the outside world?

In your emergency preparedness planning, several different types of radios should be considered for both receiving and sending information. To receive emergency radio alerts, consider having a hand-crank radio capable of receiving information from emergency broadcasts stations such as KXNT (840 AM/100.5 FM), KNPR (88.9 FM), and NOAA weather alerts. A hand-crank radio ensures you will always have power to listen to emergency broadcasts with newer radios having additional features such as a flashlight, USB charging outlet, and solar recharging.



FRS/GMRS radios provide relatively inexpensive, but limited, range 2-way communications. These radios do not require radio towers and operate using batteries allowing for operation in power outages. The range of these radios varies by model, power capabilities, and distance between radios. The caveat for legally using a GMRS radio is you must obtain a radio license from the FCC which simply requires filling out an application and paying a \$35 fee. The license can be shared among family members.



Amateur radio is the most reliable and has the most capabilities. Equipment has evolved from expensive huge antennas and radios to smaller affordable equipment, including smartphones, to allow local to international communications. Amateur radio requires an FCC license and passing an exam. Technology advances don't limit use to just talking but allow radio transmissions to be carried over the internet as well as the capability to send data and images via radios. With higher power capabilities and range, amateur radio has become the essential backup for emergency communications.



SCA has cellular and radio communication gaps meaning there is no singular means of communication within SCA that will work in every scenario. With that said, SCA residents can fill those gaps by looking at expanding your personal capabilities, and also by volunteering to assist. We encourage residents to investigate amateur radio by joining the SCA Amateur Radio Club as a way to secure your personal communications plan. Information about the club can be found in the *Spirit* magazine. Alternatively, consider looking into FRS/GMRS radios.

Having a communications plan in place will help you stay informed and help you should an event occur.

Community Service

Services Provided by Sun City Anthem Volunteer Residents for Sun City Anthem Residents.

The mission of the Community Service Committee (CSC) is to provide limited home maintenance, delivery of durable medical equipment for short-term loan, transportation services, external resources contact information, and support groups to assist residents to maintain their independence and to live in their own homes for as long as possible.

Home Maintenance: A Community Asset

Many residents consider the Community Service Committee to be one of SCA's most valuable resources. Our Home Maintenance Team began several years ago as a small group of homeowners looking to lend a helping hand to perform certain tasks that residents may not be able to safely do themselves. Today, we have 44 volunteers.

In summary, Home Maintenance will:

- Replace disposable air filters (homeowners provide).
- Replace house address light bulbs.
- Lubricate garage door bearings and springs.
- Adjust hot water re-circulator motor timer.
- Add salt (max. 25lb bags) to water-softener tank (homeowners provide).
- Replace indoor/outdoor lightbulbs that have a screw-type base (homeowners provide).
- Replace 48" fluorescent tubes in ceiling fixtures (homeowners provide).
- Replace outdated or broken smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms (CO units) (homeowners provide).
- Replace batteries in smoke detectors and CO units.

The services provided are supported by some familiarity, if not the professional expertise, of our volunteers who enthusiastically offer their personal time to help others. In 2023, Home Maintenance assisted in 1,378 service calls, averaging 6 to 8 calls per day. These services are free of charge to SCA residents. If you hire an external handyman, electrician, or plumber, starting cost may be around \$50 per hour per service and sometimes, there may be an additional travel fee to the resident's home. Any donations CSC receives from residents go towards the purchase of items such as 9V batteries, address light bulbs, and garage door lubrication supplies.

There are some tasks our team cannot perform, so an external vendor may be needed. Upon resident's request, CSC's Resources will provide referrals for feebased service vendors and their contact information. CSC does not recommend or endorse any business, person, or service, and these external vendors are used at the resident's discretion.

If you are not sure whether Home Maintenance can assist, please submit a request by using our website, **CSCHelp4U.org,** seven days a week, or by calling our Assistance Line, **(702) 614-5862.** As a reminder, your SCA Activity Card number will be needed to request services.

In this issue of the MARCH CHIEF CHAT, Gene would like to talk about safety precautions.

- Lock your doors and close your garage door when leaving home.
- Make sure the door from the garage to the living area is locked.
- Do not leave keys under the doormat or in one of those plastic rocks.
- Let your neighbors know if you are going to be gone.
- Stop delivery of the newspaper and mail if you leave for an extended period.
- Check to make sure your vehicle is locked.
- Remove your garage door opener from your vehicle if it is parked outside.
- Remove the registration and insurance documents from the glove box.
- If you have a handicap placard, remove it from your vehicle.
- Remove any items of value.
- If traveling, use the COMMUNITY PATROL HOUSE CHECK service; it's free and very popular.

There are several other free services that the patrol provides, one of which is Window/Door Security. We will come to your home and install ½" P.V.C. tubing in the slider channel of your windows and the slider door. This prevents the window/door from being moved from the outside. If this is something that you might be interested in, come to the patrol office and fill out the request form.

The patrol is always looking for volunteers. The office is open seven days a week 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Law Enforcement and NWP, Crime Fighting Partners



Following is an adaptation of an article by Officer Alex Alcantara, Henderson Police Department (HPD).


Sir Robert Peel was a British Conservative in Parliament who established the concept of professional policing in 1829. He created the Peelian Principles which defined what an ethical police force was to be.

After almost 200 years, the Peelian Principles do not need to be amended. They are still on point. My favorite, #7, states "*To maintain at all times a relationship with the public that gives reality to the historic tradition that the police are the public and that the public are the police...*". What I admire about this quote is that it demonstrates the need for the police and the community to work together as a team to prevent crime or bring those responsible for it to justice.

When a community becomes a victim of crime(s), the question people most often ask is, "What are the police doing about it?" For example, a woman in a guard-gated community "demanded the police take action" based on two property crimes (both felonies). After listening to her frustration, I politely asked her what her community was doing to help. She was taken aback. HPD needs the community's help to solve crimes as much as the community needs police to fight them. I told her about the benefits of participating in Neighborhood Watch, residents knowing the contact information of their neighbors, registering their door cameras with CAPTURE, and having home security inspections.

Despite hearing how these measures could help police with investigations, the resident indicated that the culture of her community would not "buy-in" to the programs. All I could do then was assure her HPD would continue to do their best to serve Henderson, but it would be beneficial if her community joined the team.

Henderson is a growing city and the second safest city in the U.S. HPD cannot, unfortunately, be everywhere at the exact minute police are needed. Furthermore, even if a criminal is not immediately apprehended, it does not mean detectives cannot solve it. Solving crimes may take time. However, resources provided by the community are a huge help in investigating



crimes including witness observation, camera footage, or other information. Providing these resources expedites the process. Furthermore, information shared with HPD can, and often is, shared with other law enforcement agencies in the valley. The networking between the community, HPD, and these other agencies can have a positive impact in identifying and arresting suspects. Our success rate is higher when the community works with HPD instead of relying on the police to do everything themselves.

Everyone plays a role in keeping the community and their individual residences safe. When the police and community work together, everyone benefits. Anxiety decreases and security increases. The communities that create a culture of collaborating with the police are more likely to be successful in preventing crime. A community can join the team on the playing field, or they can stay on the bench. HPD prefers you to join the team. Neighborhood Watch is the best place to start.





AMATEUR RADIO





DUPLICATE BRIDGE

Duplicate Bridge is a competitive form of bridge in which the same hands are played successively by different partnerships.

In other words, a single hand of bridge is "duplicated" so it can be played a dozen or more times in a session of bridge. Duplication of hands takes the luck of the cards out of play, thus providing fair competition. When you and your partner play a hand that is subsequently played by a dozen other pairs, the resulting range of scores represents a true picture of the relative skill of all the pairs playing that hand, and "the luck of the cards" is eliminated.

Our club is open to all levels of players, beginner through expert. The games are not sanctioned by the American Contract Bridge League; therefore, points are not awarded, however, we abide by ACBL rules and standards of play. 


HAVURAH

Jewish Tidbits: What is Purim?

Purim, a joyous festival, commemorates the Jews being saved from destruction. Almost 2,500 years ago, King Ahasuerus was celebrating his coronation as King of Persia when he killed Queen Vashti for disobeying him. King Ahasuerus then selected Esther to be his new queen, not realizing she was Jewish.

Meanwhile, Esther's wise Uncle Mordecai overheard men plotting to kill the king; his warning saved the king's life.

The king's prime minister Haman, an anti-Semite, was displeased because Mordecai would not bow down to him. Because of this,

he planned to kill all the Jews in the kingdom. To save the Jews, Mordecai helped Esther plan three days of fasting and prayer before the coronation party. Esther, against protocol, bravely sought an audience with the King. She invited King Ahasuerus and Haman to a banquet. After King Ahasuerus learned that Mordecai had saved his life without any reward from Haman, and that Haman was plotting to kill all the Jews, including Queen Esther, Haman was hanged. The Jews survived.

This year, Purim starts at sundown on March 23. After a day of fasting, there will be celebrations full of feasting, drinking, and merriment. The *Book of Esther* will be read, and Haman's name will be met with booing and shaken noisemakers.

HIKING



Winter hikes are very popular with our club. It is quite amazing how many different trails are available to us here in the Las Vegas area. One recent hike enjoyed by our group is called Red Springs Loop. For our SCA Hiking Club it is considered a level three challenging hike. It is in Red

Rock Canyon, but luckily for us the starting point is Red Springs Picnic Area. This avoids having to make a reservation for the hike.

The trail is known for its distinctive red sandstone formations. At the highest point on this trail, you will see panoramic views of the Las Vegas Valley and the surrounding mountains. The loop

hike climbs through the Calico Hills over Angel Pass (named for the unique stone carving found along the trail). There is some serious scrambling involved, so it is recommended to wear good gripping hiking shoes as well as gloves that help you grip the rocks while scrambling.

On the back half of the trail, you have the opportunity to watch scalers climb up the cliffs with ropes and gear. After descending into the wash below the Calico Hills Overlooks, the hike continues through the wash with some more scrambling around the south end of the sandstone formations.

At our January general meeting our guest speaker was Samantha Rubinson. She is a scientifically trained historical archaeologist who runs the Nevada Site Stewardship Program for the Nevada State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO).

Samantha showed us photos of various sites around Clark County where stewardship work is needed. She explained the duties of the SHPO and helped us understand how we can integrate our club activities into their events. Volunteers with this program make regular checks on historic artifacts, historical buildings, and monuments in the region. Our club could adopt a site to monitor along our favorite hiking trails and report on those.



STRATEGY GAMES



The Strategy Games Club has many fun and challenging games to suit players of all skill levels. Come check out our games library, where we have over 70 games ranging from easy to complex. There's something for you.

If you're skittish and a little intimidated by the word "strategy" – don't be! We have an informal mentoring system, where members teach other members and take newbies under their wings.

Did you know that card games are sometimes placed into the same category as board games, even if they do not include a board? The table itself could be considered to form the board.

Two super fun-to-play and popular card games are Ohanami and Scout.

OHANAMI consists of a deck of 120 cards, numbered from 1 to





120, with each card having one of four colors and symbols. At the start of a round, players receive 10 cards, choose two cards, then pass the remaining cards to their neighbor.

Players reveal their two cards at the same time, then decide whether to use any or all of them in personal rows of cards. Starting a row, a player can use any card, but to add a card to an existing row, that card must be higher than the row's highest card or lower than the lowest one. A player can have at most three rows of cards. The game lasts three rounds, with players scoring at the end of each round, in addition to bonus scoring at the end of the game.

SCOUT is a game in which cards are dual-indexed, having different values on each half of the card. Once cards are dealt to players, they pick up that hand without rearranging any cards. If they wish, they can rotate their entire hand in order to use the values on the other end of each card – again, without rearranging any cards. On a turn, a player can choose one or more adjacent cards in their hand that have all the same value or that have values in consecutive order.

Scout is considered a ladder-climbing game, meaning that each player's objective is to "one up" the previous play – lay down



cards in either a set or a run sufficient to beat what had been played before.

Come to one of our club's three weekly sessions, and we'll teach you how to play Ohanami, Scout, or any of our other games. We meet in the Liberty Center multipurpose rooms Saturdays and Mondays from 1 to 5 p.m. and Thursdays from 5 to 9 p.m. Our dues are \$7, but come try us out for free! Come at the beginning of the session and stay for one game, two or more! We are a collegial group that just wants to have fun, and we look forward to meeting you.


