

Living Life at SCA: What It Takes

Effective Communication Is Essential



All effective communication tells a story. It uses clear language without ambiguous meanings; it is concise but complete so it's easy to understand the message. The SCA Board has made it a priority to effectively communicate with our community members.

We have a variety of ways we communicate. Our monthly **Spirit** magazine is mailed to every household each month. It serves as the official notice of board meetings and the *Relay* insert includes a calendar and other important information. Many residents don't realize the advertising in the *Spirit* covers the cost of printing and mailing the magazine and generates a profit. Our website includes information about SCA governance, amenities, and services. We have a weekly electronic newsletter and eBlasts that are sent to each household that has "opted-in". The newsletter, *Community Chronicles*, provides up-to-date information about project updates, events, and meetings. If you're not signed up for electronic communications, it is easy to do from the website or you can go to Member Services for help.

As part of the Board of Directors' goal to improve communication we formed a Communication Governance Committee (CGC). The charter was approved last July and Joan Roth was appointed as the chair. We feel fortunate to have Ms. Roth since she brings a wealth of experience. Prior to self-management she served as the chair of a previous communication committee. In the fall we recruited and approved members to serve on the CGC. Three sub-committees were formed to focus on print and media, video and our website. Since forming, the CGC has been engaged in various initiatives to help us communicate more effectively. Recently they filmed election videos and organized focus groups to get feedback from residents. They are improving the look and function of *Community Chronicles*, the weekly newsletter. The CGC is also updating the print and style guidelines to assist clubs and administration with communication. Another important initiative is cleaning up website content to make it more functional in preparation for a conversion to a new website.

Recently SCA has begun re-structuring management. One new position is a Chief Technology Officer and Richard James was welcomed aboard on April 1. He has worked as a consultant with SCA for several years and is well-qualified to take us to the next level. He will spearhead the installation of a new technology system that will be integrated across departments and functions. A workgroup that included Mr. James, board members, the Communications and Finance Committees, reviewed various systems used by other large scale HOAs. We were unanimous in our agreement that Global Northstar Technologies has the capability to meet our technology needs. A new website will be more functional and easier for residents to use. We'll keep you updated as this important project moves forward.

Your board and our committees are diligently working to make sure you have the information you need from us. Let us know how we're doing, or attend the Communications Committee meeting usually held the second Wednesday of each month to find out more about our efforts.

All Board of Directors meetings are recorded. Unit owners can request a copy of the audio recording. They can also request a copy of the meeting minutes or summary of the meeting. Electronic copies will be sent at no charge. Alternatively, a printed version will be available at a cost not to exceed 25 cents per page for the first 10 pages, and 10 cents per page thereafter.

Unit owners have a right to speak to the Board during the BOD meeting unless the Board is meeting in Executive Session. There are two comment periods set aside for homeowners to speak: one at the end of the first section of the agenda regarding agenda items only, and the other at the end of the meeting for general comments.



Request an Inspection of **Your Exterior Residence by** the ARC and/or Community Standards Department.

If you are unsure that your home is in compliance with Sun City Anthem's governing documents, or are looking to sell your home and provide the buyer documentation displaying your property is in compliance, you may want to request an inspection of your residence by the ARC and/or Community Standards Department. Inspectors will advise you about how to bring your home into compliance. Once issues are addressed, they will issue a Certificate of Compliance with the date of inspection. A copy of the Certificate of Compliance will be maintained in the property's permanent file.





ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW

Plan review: second and fourth Thursdays, 9 to 10:30 a.m. Emerson/Franklin Rooms, **NO IN-PERSON ATTENDANCE** because plan information shared is confidential. Applicants must be available by phone.

Topic of the Month: Site Plan Requirements for various types of jobs.

Design Guidelines Site Plan Requirement – Paragraph I.D.1 page 7 of 9 of Design Guidelines:

Site Plan: A legible site plan (a minimum of 8 ½ x 11" and maximum of 11 x 17" in size) drawn to scale showing the size of the lot and the finished floor elevation. The site plan shall include, as applicable, setbacks, property lines, courtyard walls, fences, proposed driveway showing widths, dimensions for proposed paving, parking, concrete curbs, planters, sidewalks, location of trash enclosures, lighting (size and type), grading and drainage of the lot, and include the square footage of any additional concrete, etc. all with dimensions and a north arrow. Dimension all setbacks from the property lines to existing structures and any proposed modifications on the property.

The Site Plan requirement statement above is extremely detailed and is aimed primarily at requirements for complex jobs (Additions, expansions, casitas, pools and spas, walls and fences, and solar panels) which involve more complex and extensive work typically performed by professional contractors. Typically, the contractors would provide the homeowner a detailed professionally developed scaled drawing. The homeowner, after reviewing the documentation and agreeing that the documents represent the homeowner's expectations for the job, can submit these drawings with a completed application.

Most of the work SCA homeowners submit for approval are much less complex jobs – however may require the homeowner to develop the required drawings. The Sub-ARC understands this and can be flexible with the specific required details for the specific job on a case-by-case basis. Work like patio covers, complex landscaping jobs, walls and fences, and hardscape (concrete, pavers, or flagstones) require certain specific detailed information but not nearly as much as a casita or addition. However, please understand that we need to have enough detailed information to know exactly what you're planning to do, so that we can determine from the documents provided, whether what is being proposed is compliant to the Design Guidelines.

Work related to windows - replacements, solar shades, security screens, rolling shutters, etc., can be proposed by using a Model Floor Plan for your model – simply mark which windows you are proposing to have work done on, the work you're proposing, and other details – such as style and color selected. If other jobs are very simple and can be explained sufficiently with a few photographs (two or three – NOT 20, please) that may be

sufficient. Again, the Sub-ARC can be flexible and use common sense.

The Covenants Committee hearing tribunal reviews the information regarding an alleged violation and determines whether a violation of the standards set forth in the Governing Documents occurred. This committee is responsible for imposing fines and/or sanctions. Following a hearing before the Covenants Committee, the alleged violator has the right to appeal the decision to the Board. Covenants meetings are not open to residents unless invited.

- If you aren't notified, go to Settings and enable QR Code Scanning.

SNWA Offering Larger Cash-for-Grass Incentives



Calling all homeowners! The residential Water Smart Landscape Rebate has been temporarily increased from \$3 to \$5 per square foot of grass upgraded to water-efficient landscaping. The rebate for business, HOA, and multifamily properties remains \$3 per square foot, and will decrease to \$2 per square foot January 1, 2025. Take advantage while the offer lasts.

Spring into action this season by trading your grass for cash with the Southern Nevada Water Authority's (SNWA) biggest incentive ever. The SNWA has temporarily increased the Water Smart Landscape Rebate (WSLR) for homeowners from \$3 to \$5 per square foot of grass upgraded to water-efficient landscaping for the rest of 2024.

Qualifying homeowners will receive \$5 for each square foot of grass they convert (up to the first 10,000 square feet) to dripirrigated, desert-adapted plants and trees, and \$3.50 for each additional square foot. Conversions must be completed by the end of 2024 to receive the increased incentive.

Businesses, municipalities, community associations, and multi-family properties remain eligible for the current \$3 per square foot incentive, which will decrease to \$2 per square foot for nonfunctional, decorative grass beginning in 2025.

Outdoor landscaping is the biggest user of Southern Nevada's limited water supply. By converting to a Water Smart landscape, you'll use 55 gallons of water less per square foot than thirsty-grass landscapes.

While it can seem daunting to consider removing your home's grass, embracing a lawn-free landscape not only conserves water but also reduces maintenance efforts, allowing for a more sustainable and vibrant outdoor space. Here are some common myths associated with water-smart landscapes:

"Water Smart Landscaping will make my house hotter."

• Shade is the key to keeping you cool in the desert. Grass feels cool because so much water is evaporating from it. There are dozens of water-efficient trees and plants that can be used to shade south and west exposure from our relentless desert sun, while using less water; consult the Plant Search Tool on SNWA.com to find what works best for you. Also, as part of the WSL rebate, the Tree Enhancement Program offers \$100 bonuses to new participants for each qualifying tree planted during landscape conversions. It's a shady deal you will want to take advantage of, providing much-needed shade against the urban heat island effect.

"It takes too long for water-efficient plants to mature and achieve SNWA's required 50% canopy."

• You can save money on labor and plant material costs by planting smaller sized plants. It doesn't matter if you install a one-gallon or a five-gallon plant; the SNWA will give you the same maturity credit. And most plants when watered properly—fill in or grow quickly.

"All desert plants and rocks are ugly."

• Water-smart landscaping is so much more than rocks and cacti. With over 500 plant options that are resilient enough to tolerate our harsh environment and soil conditions, coupled with thoughtful design and selection, achieving a beautiful landscape while conserving water is possible.

As we enter spring, it's also time to change your watering clock. Seasonal watering restrictions are in effect and limits landscape watering to up to three assigned days per week (Sunday watering is prohibited all year). You can increase your savings without harming your landscape by slowly "ramping up" irrigation schedules, adding the second and third watering days only as temperatures warm up and weather patterns permit. If you have plants and trees on drip systems, they require significantly less water, typically needing to be watered every one to two days in spring.

Spring is a great time to upgrade your grass to a beautiful water-efficient landscape! To apply for the WSL program, and for program conditions and criteria visit **SNWA.com.**

SCA supports the removal of grass and the installation of desert landscaping for each home in our community. It is the goal of SCA to save even more water this year. With these rebates from SNWA this is the time to cut your maintenance and water bill by installing desert landscaping and artificial grass. Remember to submit plans with the Architectural Review Committee at ARC-Committee@scacai.com for any changes to the front yard; however, no approval is needed for the rear yard.

Spraying Weeds is Not Enough!!!

Many homeowners are not aware that the area between their wall and the sidewalk is part of their property. This area may be neglected and become weedy. Remember to patrol your entire lot weekly to remove weeds and maintain an attractively landscaped lot. Each homeowner contributes to the overall appearance of Sun City Anthem.

Although uniform inspections are conducted quarterly, you can still file complaints for violations you see in the community. Do you see a property in your neighborhood that is in violation of the landscape maintenance requirements for Sun City Anthem? Is the lot weedy? Are there are dead or dying plants? If you see any landscape violation, you may submit a report to the Community Standards Department, and we will process the alleged violation. Reporting a violation that you have personally seen and believe to be out of compliance can be accomplished in several ways:

- Call (702) 638-5751, simply provide the address of the lot and the description of the landscape issue as well as the location on the lot (front yard, side yard). Email to Compliance@scacai.com - provide the address and a description of the issue.
- Send a note in the mail to: 2450 Hampton Road, Henderson, NV 89052
- Bring in a written complaint or complete a tan card (aka comment card/form). Tan cards are in all the centers and



a monitor can guide you to find one. You can either place the completed form in the drop box on the wall or bring it in to the Member Services Desk at Anthem Center.

The Association keeps this information confidential.

Once a resident reports an address where landscape maintenance is needed, an inspection of the property is conducted from the roadway. Once verified, a notice is sent to the property owner. Normally, 30 days are allowed for compliance to be achieved.

Spraying the weeds is not enough. The weeds must be totally removed and not just sprayed (leaving the dead weeds visible). Dead plants must also be removed, and replaced if necessary, to retain minimum landscape standards.

Mandatory Spring Watering Schedule



As spring gives way to the heat of summer, you may need to pump up your irrigation watering. The Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) reminds residents that the summer watering restrictions are in effect May 1 through August 30.

The summer restrictions allow spray irrigation up to six assigned days per week. No landscape watering between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. Landscape irrigation is prohibited on Sunday year-round. To find your assigned watering days, and for tips on how to water or maintain your landscape, visit SNWA.com.

You can save water (and money) on your bills by slowly "ramping up" your irrigation schedule from three to more days as it gets warmer and as weather patterns permit.

Watering on Sundays or allowing water to spray or flow off your property could incur fines ranging from \$40 to \$80 for the first violation, and up to \$1,280 for repeated violations. Along with following the seasonal restrictions, periodically inspecting your landscape irrigation system for broken or misaligned sprinklers can help you avoid potentially costly water-waste fines.

Conserving water and reporting and preventing water-waste are critical as the water shortage declaration on the Colorado River limits the amount of water Southern Nevada can withdraw from Lake Mead (the source of 90 percent of our supply) by seven billion gallons this year.

Another way you can help conserve the community's most vital natural resource is by upgrading your thirsty grass with beautiful water-efficient plants, trees, and shrubs through the SNWA Water Smart Landscapes Rebate Program (WSL). WSL offers a cash incentive of up to \$3 for each square foot of turf converted to dripirrigated landscaping. (Some restrictions apply.) Find out more and enroll today at SNWA.com.

I only hope that the mountain snow finds its way into Lake Mead because we could all benefit from that. We also benefit from the many residents who donate their time to helping our community and the people who live in our 7,144 homes.

I recently received a "courtesy notice" from Community Standards because my address lights had burnt out. I immediately went online to the Community Service Committee's website and place a request to have the lights replaced. Two days later, a Community Service van pulled up and two wonderful volunteers jumped out and changed my lights in the blink of an eye. What a wonderful service! We have hundreds of residents who donate time to make this a better place for all of us. Consider helping Community Service help our community. You might be surprised how gratifying an hour or two, or more of volunteering can be.

There are no limits as to how many Service Committees any one resident can join. They all need your help.

Community Patrol - serves as the eyes and ears for HPD; drives marked vehicles in 4-hour shifts to observe & report suspicious and unsafe conditions; conducts "vacation checks"; maintains registries of pets and dementia residents; notifies residents of open garage doors or improperly parked vehicles. Training is provided.

Community Service - assists residents with tasks they are unable to perform; provides short-term loans of medical equipment; sponsors support groups and helps residents maintain independence by remaining in their homes as long as possible.

Emergency Preparedness - provides recommendations, guidance, and direction on the preparation for emergencies affecting the SCA. If an emergency or disaster occurs, EPSG will



provide operational response, support, and guidance to the SCA Community.

Neighborhood Watch - provides a cooperative approach with HPD to promote resident education in areas of crime prevention, safety & quality of life. Block Captains are needed in all villages. Village Facilitators are needed in Big Sky, Black Mountain, Clubhouse, Hillside and Pinnacle.

Parking on SCA Streets

It is legal to park vehicles on the street in SCA. However, the vehicle must be moved every 72-hours. If you see a vehicle parked in one place for longer than that, call Henderson Police Parking/Traffic Division at (702) 267-5093 to report it. Parking of vehicles without current registration or inoperable vehicles on city streets is not allowed at any time. Parking RVs on the street is legal (subject to the 72-hour rule), but it is NOT legal to

provide hookups. That is considered camping, and is prohibited outside a designated camping area by Henderson City ordinance.

One boat or recreational vehicle may be temporarily kept on a driveway (only if it fits and does not hang over onto a sidewalk or the street) for not more than four nights within each calendar month.

Emergency Preparedness

Is There A Plan?



The March 2, 2024 power outage was a reminder that a variety of events can occur which can directly impact our daily lives. In 2020, the Covid pandemic necessitated creation of the Covid-19 Taskforce and planned to address the unique needs of SCA residents. This plan evolved into an

Emergency Response Plan based on an earthquake of such magnitude that significant damage to SCA residences with immediate resident needs would be anticipated. The plan recognized the Henderson Fire Department station located in SCA would be sent to do the greatest good for the greatest number of people, which may not include SCA. As a result, the plan called for deploying teams into SCA villages to conduct rapid damage assessments and identify residents with urgent needs. Disaster assessment data would be communicated to the City of Henderson Office of Emergency Preparedness thereby initiating the first steps in obtaining assistance. Urgent resident needs would be communicated to appropriate resources for assistance.

The EPSG maintains an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) which allows for rapid assessment of an event to determine the impact to SCA residents and plan a response if needed. An EPSG member is on call 24/7, 365 days a year to assess any event and determine if the plan needs to be activated. If an activation is warranted, as occurred with the recent power outages, plan members are advised to respond to the EOC. The SCA Chief Operating Officer and designated staff are alerted to the activation and collaborative efforts are started to ensure the safety of SCA residents, staff, and facilities. Initial and ongoing bidirectional communications are established with City of Henderson's EOC using pre-established direct phone/text, amateur radio, or digital communication.




Some activities of the plan are not readily visible. For example, the plan recognizes rapid, accurate, and timely dissemination of information to residents is imperative. Currently, EPSG can disseminate information via eBlasts (sign up if you have not) which can be read on a computer or cellphone email, a dialin line with pre-recorded information, and should cellphone service be unavailable, placing information flyers on village mailboxes. EPSG had investigated using radio broadcasts, but this was prohibited by the Federal Communications Commission. EPSG is also working with SCA Administration to investigate the feasibility of informational phone calls or text messages being sent directly to a landline or cellphones.

As the plan has evolved, the need to include the expertise and resources of other SCA service groups and clubs in meeting any challenges has become apparent and is being addressed. During the power outage, Neighborhood Watch played a crucial role by providing real-time and updated information directly to the EOC. This information allowed the EPSG and SCA Management to research resident contingency plans should the power outage have continued into the night.

This work is ongoing, evolving, and more volunteers are needed at every level to meet our unique challenges.

Community Service

Services Provided by Sun City Anthem Volunteer Residents for Sun City Anthem Residents.

The mission of the Community Service Committee (CSC) is to provide limited home maintenance, delivery of durable medical equipment for short-term loan, transportation services, external resources contact information, and support groups to assist residents to maintain their independence and to live in their own homes for as long as possible.



How Can We Help You?

Residents can request CSC's services by using our website, CSCHelp4U.org, seven days a week, or by calling our Assistance Line, (702) 614-5862. Clearly state your telephone number when leaving messages on CSC's Assistance Line and ensure availability for CSC to leave messages on your answering machine. As a reminder, your SCA Activity Card number will be needed to request services.

- Our Medical Equipment team maintains and delivers durable medical equipment for short-term loan including canes, crutches, wheelchairs, walkers, shower chairs, and more.
- The *Home Maintenance* team performs certain tasks that residents may not be able to safely do themselves, such as replacing batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms, light bulbs, house address bulbs, HVAC filters, adding salt to water softeners, and lubricating garage doors.
- CSC's *Transportation* team provides, with certain parameters, rides locally to healthcare appointments, pharmacies, grocery stores, and all SCA community centers.
- Support Groups provide residents and their families and friends with a forum to share individual experiences, concerns, challenges, and successes. Check the SCA weekly Community Chronicles eBlast for dates, times, and locations.
- Our *Communications* team maintains the Assistance Line and connects residents and their requests with the appropriate service and/or support groups.
- Resources maintains a list of a variety of fee-based service vendors and their contact information. CSC does not recommend or endorse any business, person, or service.
- The **Public Relations** role focuses on informing you of CSC's activities through SCA's weekly Community Chronicles, monthly Spirit, and via collateral materials, such as brochures, pamphlets, and fliers.

All services provided by the Community Service Committee are free of charge. Donations are greatly appreciated and benefit CSC directly so that volunteers can continue to provide services and sponsor support groups. Recognition for the Great Volunteers of the Community Patrol

There is no other group of volunteers more dedicated than the ones that are part of the COMMUNITY PATROL FAMILY. We have walkers, bikers, dispatchers, watch commanders, house checkers and drivers. There is a ninemember board consisting of myself, two Assistant Chiefs, Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Emeritus, and three Members-at-

All members are asked to volunteer a minimum of four hours a week in any capacity. However, we have many members who regularly volunteer eight to twelve hours or more per week. Recently at one of our social events, we recognized five members

who have over twenty years of uninterrupted service. They are Carol Kornblum, David Booth, Barbara Seely, Samaria Graham, and Philip Schimmell. We also have many members with between 10 and 19 years of service.

For the year 2023, we had 115 members who accumulated 24,993 volunteer hours. We completed 11,910 Vacation House Checks and notified 490 residents that their garage doors were open. We responded to 16 emergency lights and issued 196 parking reminders. We put almost 77,000 miles on our three patrol cars.

In the Anthem Center near the TV viewing area there are plaques mounted on the wall that recognize patrol members that have volunteered 1,000 to 4,000 hours. This year we added eight new names to the 1,000-hour plaque, four to the 2,000-hour plaque, two to the 3,000-hour plaque, and four to the 4,000-hour plaque. Others of note include Barbara Seely with 5,000 hours, Pat Monsees with 6,000 hours, and Ed Miller with 10,000 hours. We have an annual Patrol Awards Breakfast in March, and this year Pat Monsees was recognized as the Outstanding Volunteer of the Year for 2023.

As the Chief, I could not be prouder of this dedicated group of volunteers. Stop by our office and say hello to our Dispatcher on duty or to use any of the services we provide.

Home Security Survey

Burglary and theft are crimes of opportunity. A door that is easy to open or an open window or garage door are all seen as opportunities by criminals. By thinking about safety and security first, and taking some simple steps to secure your home, you can reduce these opportunities.

Begin by going to the end of your block and walking toward your home. Keep in mind the criminal is looking for an opportunity

For information about the SCA NW Program, click the link on the Community page of the SCA website. to commit a crime, take some property, or get into your home. Do you have tools or other items in open view? Is your garage door open? What about your windows and doors? Is the gate to your backyard closed and locked? Does your home and yard look well kept, or will the criminal think you might be an easy target? Make sure you can check off each of the following items:

Front Yard

- ___ Street sign and house numbers easily visible.
- __ Bushes, shrubs, and trees pruned away from sidewalks, driveways, doors, windows, and gates.
- __ Limited access to the yard.
- __ Lighting covers the entire front of the house and all hiding places.

Back & Side Yards

- __ Lighting adequately covers each entrance.
- __ Bushes, shrubs, and trees adequately maintained.
- __ Fences and gates secure.
- __ Landscape lights on "Dusk to Dawn" timer.

Garage

- __ Keep door closed when not in use.
- __ Door operates properly.
- __ Windows in the door are not recommended.
- __ If you have a side door, is the lock secure?.

Entry Doors

- __ Deadbolt locks with minimum one inch (1") throw.
- __ Security strike plates with a minimum of four screws, each 3" long.
- __ Door jambs tight and secure.
- __ Door molding tight and secure.
- Sliders have anti-slide device (either locking mechanism or PVC pipe).

And remember, if someone knocks on your door or rings your doorbell, DO NOT IGNORE IT. Let them know someone is home. Verify who they are before opening your door. Install a video doorbell or exterior security camera so you always know who is outside your door.



Nourishing Your Brain for Better Performance



What we eat can change how well our brains work, including our memory and problemsolving skills. Our brain needs a lot of energy from complex carbohydrates like whole grains, vegetables, and fruits. What we eat or don't eat can change our brain health.

 Foods like fatty fish and walnuts, which are high in omega-3 fatty

acids, can make our memory and brain skills better by improving the structure of our brain cells.

- · Antioxidants, found in foods like berries and dark chocolate, can stop damage from free radicals and make communication between brain cells better, which also improves our brain skills.
- Our brains are about 75% water. Even a little bit of dehydration can make our short-term memory, focus, and decision making worse. So, it's important to drink enough water every day.

Eating the right foods, protecting our brain with antioxidants, and drinking enough water can make our brain skills work better.



CERAMICS

The Ceramics Club offers the opportunity to explore many aspects of ceramics - throwing on a wheel, hand building with clay, finishing molded greenware or bisque - and will soon expand our capabilities to include pouring our own greenware. We have procured a pouring table and are developing the procedures and acquiring the essential equipment to begin the process.

Many of our new members are interested in creating their own items from clay. Jan Stahl teaches them how to wedge clay and use the slab roller, the basics of hand building, how to score and slip an item, and glazing a piece, including the correct glazes to use for firing at Cone 6. She introduces members to common ceramics terms and general practices, and shows them the many molds, stamps and tools the club has available. She also reviews specific club operations so that they are set up for success from their first project on.

For more advanced hand builders, Jan repeated her popular Hump and Slump Class last month. The hump technique refers to molding a thin slab of clay over an inverted bowl or other convex shape while the slump technique involves slumping the clay into the bowl or concave receptacle. Once the clay is leather hard it will retain the shape and is removed from the mold. Clay slabs can be textured with rollers or stamps prior to molding or the greenware can be carved or decorated before firing to bisque. Using a mold allows the ceramicist to recreate a piece multiple times with consistent results, and the mold provides support for the clay in larger pieces.

DUPLICATE BRIDGE

Jewish Tidbits - End of Life Traditions and Customs

Traditional Jewish observances surrounding death and mourning focus on maintaining the dignity of the deceased and comforting the mourners. For example, the dead are carefully washed and clothed in white robes. Embalming is forbidden. Jewish values discourage an open casket. Burial must take place as soon as possible following death. The first of three mourning periods, called Shiva, starts after the funeral, and is observed for up to seven days. During this period, mourners commonly don't go to work and may avoid pleasures such as parties. Comforting the mourners consists of visiting, bringing food, and saying special prayers together. The mourners say a special prayer daily in praise of G-d, called Kaddish. Observant Jews will do this every day for an eleven-month period. This devotion is regarded as an act of reverence for the deceased.

HIKING



Hike leader Steve Zorick has been doing "A Day in the Mojave Preserve" excursion for many years. This excursion includes 3 hikes, described below.

On our recent trip, the day began with a carpool out to our first stop called Hole in the Wall. This is a fascinating geological

feature nestled within the rugged landscapes of the Mojave Desert in California. The name "Hole in the Wall" describes the main attraction of the area—a natural gap or passageway carved into the rugged cliffs of volcanic rock. This gap was formed over millions of years through the relentless erosion of softer rock layers by wind, water, and other environmental factors.

Another feature of this trail are the rings which are fixed into the side of large boulders to help you scramble up and down the rocks. The area has been inhabited by Native American tribes for thousands of years, and evidence of their presence can still be found in the form of petroglyphs and other archaeological remains scattered throughout the desert.

Next, we traveled to Amboy Crater which was formed over thousands of years through a series of volcanic eruptions. Amboy Crater is estimated to be around 79,000 years old. This cinder cone volcano is a prominent feature within the vast expanse of the desert, rising approximately 250 feet above the surrounding terrain.


Steve led our hikers up a trail around the base of the crater and

up to its rim, which offered stunning views of the surrounding landscape. Today, Amboy Crater is a popular destination for hikers, nature enthusiasts, and geology buffs. This hike is moderate in difficulty, making it accessible to visitors of various ages and skill levels.

Then we headed to our final destination, Lava Tube with the Beam. This geological wonder offers visitors a glimpse into the fascinating world of underground caves and lava formations. What makes this location captivating is the presence of a natural skylight known as the "Beam." This unique feature occurs when sunlight streams through an opening in the roof of the cave, casting a beam of light that illuminates the dark interior. The effect is nothing short of magical, creating a surreal atmosphere that captivates visitors as they explore the depths of the cave.

Exploring the Lava Tube requires a willingness to navigate through narrow passages and uneven terrain. Flashlights or headlamps are essential for illuminating the path and revealing the details of the cave's interior.

The highlight of the Lava Tube experience is undoubtedly the moment when visitors catch sight of the Beam. As sunlight filters through the opening in the cave's roof, it casts a golden beam that pierces the darkness and bathes the cave in a warm glow.

May 1 - Have you ever danced the Maypole dance? The oldest evidence of its existence is from medieval times in Germany and Roman Britain. It was reputedly introduced by slaves in the Caribbean and is the national dance of St. Vincent Island. The tradition has been practiced around the world in many countries as a rite of spring or summer.





STRATEGY GAMES

The Strategy Games Club has many fun and challenging games, to suit players of all skill levels. Come check out our games library, where we have over 70 games ranging from easy to complex. There's something for you.

If you're skittish and a little intimidated by the word "strategy" don't be! We have an informal mentoring system, where members teach other members and take newbies under their wings.

Our club has many tile-laying games, and BARENPARK is a club-favorite. Players compete to build the best bear park by covering every square grid possible in their park area. Each player starts with a basic park board and receives a starting tile. Players claim Tetris-like (polyomino) shaped tiles and add them to their park grounds - boards with grids that have colorful icons variously positioned on them.







When players cover the icons by placing tiles on their boards, they can choose from area tiles. Cover a green wheelbarrow, choose from green area tiles; cover a white cement truck, choose from animal house tiles; cover an orange excavator, choose an animal enclosure tile. Get a new park grid when you cover a construction crew. Cover more than one icon in a turn, pick corresponding tiles. Tiles go into your supply for use on subsequent turns. New tiles must be placed adjacent to old ones.

If you see the perfect tile for your park, you just need to figure out this turn how to cover an icon that will let you grab that perfect tile for next turn. When picking tiles, the shape will be one factor in your decision, but so will the point value of that particular enclosure.

A park can have a maximum of four park area boards, including the entrance (start board). When a player completes a fourth board, the game is over and points are tallied.

At its core, Barenpark is a race game. Tiles and bear statues are stacked in descending order of points. First to grab one kind of tile scores the most points for that tile, first to complete a park board and grab a bear statue, gets the highest scoring bear statue.

Come to one of our club's three weekly sessions, and we'll teach you how to play Barenpark or any of our other games. We meet in the Liberty Center Saturdays and Mondays from 1 to 5 p.m., and Thursdays from 5 p.m. on. Our dues are \$7, but come try us out for free! Come at the beginning of the session, and stay for one game, two or more! We are a collegial group that just wants to have fun, and we look forward to meeting you.

Road to Woodworking

Woodchip projects have been featured in our Spirit articles many times over the years. Mostly, they showcase the skills of senior

members and our shop's capability. Typically, they are impressive projects such as wall units or even a complete kitchen remodel. But, what about new members, what do they make? And, how about people who joined the club with no or limited woodworking experience, how do they fair in developing skills and integrating into the club? Joe Ritter has agreed to share his Woodchips journey.

Joe's previous woodworking experience was many years ago in high school shop. He owns a few hand tools, electric drill, and a circular saw. He joined Woodchips about 15 months ago. After attending the required equipment training clusters, Joe was ready to start his first project, a simple picture frame. This is a good beginner project because it requires using all the basic equipment: table saw, jointer, planner, and belt sander. These are always used in any project and building proficiency with this equipment is necessary to becoming a better woodworker. But Joe didn't join Woodchips just to make a picture frame; he had a desire to build some of the projects he sees posted in the photo gallery on our website. The training clusters will teach safe equipment operation, but not how to plan and build a complex project. While making his picture frame, Joe quickly learned three things about our club. As Joe became friends with more members, he asked several to mentor him on a larger project, an entertainment center. This is where our club shines.
