

ver the past year we have used this column to feature each of the departments that make SCA the place

While we have talked about the employees in each of the departments and how they contribute to the sense of community, this month we want to focus on the difficulties our employees experience in fulfilling our mission to enhance the quality of our residents' lives through clubs, activities, fitness, and amenities. An important part of our mission is to enforce governing documents fairly and equitably. Employees engage in every aspect of our mission.

Increasingly, while just trying to do their job, our employees have been subjected to uncooperative behavior from residents. Such behavior is in response to reasonable requests to scan their resident card or comply with health and safety rules while in the centers. At times, this behavior escalates to threats, name-calling, and personal attacks. This is unacceptable and cannot be tolerated due to the harm it causes. The board and management are reviewing our compliance enforcement policy to determine our next steps. Egregious and repeated instances of hostile, abusive and uncooperative behavior can result in fines or suspension of a resident's privileges. Our Board takes seriously the responsibility of making sure employees are treated with respect.

We are a community of older adults. This means our residents bring a lot of life experience, wisdom, and a knowledge of the importance of friends and community. All of us have difficulties at times living in a community because it takes effort to compromise and accommodate others and balance our needs with those of others. None of us like limitations or constraints. However, practicing the art of living with others and the resulting positive atmosphere it creates for everyone, is worth the effort.







All owners are encouraged to attend the Board meetings. GoToMeeting information will be available for members who cannot attend in-person. The log-in information will be printed at the top of the meeting agendas and can be found in the Community Chronicles eBlast the Monday before the Board meeting.

All Board of Directors meetings are recorded. Unit owners can request a copy of the audio recording. They can also request a copy of the meeting minutes or summary of the meeting. Electronic copies will be sent at no charge. Alternatively, a printed version will be available at a cost not to exceed 25 cents per page for the first 10 pages, and 10 cents per page

Unit owners have a right to speak to the Board during the BOD meeting unless the Board is meeting in Executive Session. There are two comment periods set aside for homeowners to speak: one at the end of the first section of the agenda regarding agenda items only, and the other at the end of the meeting for general comments.



As the amenities age, we must continue to maintain and update the communal area. Here are a few of the larger projects that are on our list:

Plan review: second and fourth Thursdays, 9 to 10:30 a.m. Emerson/Franklin Rooms, no in-person attendance

A reminder that the revised Design Guidelines and Rules and Regulations (with several changes) went into effect on 01/01/2023. A hard copy of both the Design Guidelines and the Rules and Regulations were mailed to every homeowner in Sun City Anthem, and a digital copy can be accessed on the Sun City Anthem website.

Topic of the month: exterior changes

Please remember that all exterior modifications, upgrades, and improvements require written ARC approval prior to starting any project.

We strongly encourage homeowners to review the Design Guidelines and the Rules and Regulations before submitting a request to modify their residence. You should get approval for your project before entering into a contract and placing a deposit with a contractor.

How to submit your request

We recognize how important modifications, upgrades, and improvements are to each SCA resident. To make ARC approval as painless as possible and in lieu of homeowners attending the ARC meetings, residents can email their applications and plans to ARC-Committee@scacai.com, or send them by UPS or mail, or drop them off at one of the lockboxes located outside of all our centers. To facilitate processing of your project, we now only require one copy of your submittal; once received, it will be reviewed at the next scheduled meeting, and the results will be mailed/emailed back to the homeowner.

If you are submitting plans for review, please sign and date the site plan and be available by phone during the plan review time as listed above. If you will not be available at the listed phone number, it is very important that you submit a phone number where you may be reached during this period. Be aware that the ARC member may be calling you from an area code other than 702, so you should answer all incoming calls during the plan review period. If you cannot be reached by phone, they will reject your project or return your submitted paperwork by mail or email with a request for further information, and your project will be revisited at the next scheduled meeting.

As always, email us at the above address or contact the Community Standards Department with any questions or concerns.

The Community Standards staff and volunteers look forward to continuing to assist the members of SCA in maintaining our community's aesthetics.

COVENANTS

The Board of Directors, as required in Article 5.2 of the Bylaws, established a Deed Restriction Enforcement Committee. At Sun City Anthem, this committee is called Covenants.

The Covenants Committee is the hearing tribunal of the Association and conducts hearings pursuant to Section 3.26 of the Bylaws and Article 7.4 of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions.

Hearings are normally scheduled once a month. Should you have any questions, please contact Compliance@SCACAI.com. A hearing is scheduled when a case cannot be resolved during the enforcement process.

The Covenants Committee hearing tribunal reviews the information regarding an alleged violation and determines whether a violation of the standards set forth in the Governing Documents occurred. This committee is responsible for imposing fines and/or sanctions. Following a hearing before the Covenants Committee, the alleged violator has the right to appeal the decision to the Board. Covenants meetings are not open to residents unless invited.

Common area fence painting began on June 3. The contractor began in Arroyo Vista with spot prime painting and painting of the wrought iron fencing. Approximately six weeks will be required to complete Arroya Vista. Of course, all work is dependent on weather conditions.

Committee Reports

Homeowners will have the opportunity to have their own fence painted at the same cost that the HOA is charged. Six neighborhoods are scheduled to be completed by the end of 2025. Please refer to the May 27 SCA Community Chronicles for further information on your neighborhood. Or call the SCA Facilities Maintenance department at (702) 614-5863 for any questions you may have.

A recommendation was made to extend the two-year terms for Neal Matzkin and Ben Rosen on the Facilities and Landscaping Committee. Neal was appointed Vice-Chair of our committee.

The Facilities and Landscaping department's additional office space may be delayed until early fall. The City of Henderson originally approved the placement of an office trailer on the side of the Anthem Center adjacent to their present offices. They are now requiring a public meeting to hear comments from the residents of the homes facing the Anthem Center and placement of the additional offices. Stay tuned.

Change of plans necessitated the rescheduling of Fred Kolkmann from Tennis and Sports Services LLC to evaluate our 15 sports courts. His evaluation will include proper timing of maintenance procedures of the SCA courts, and any immediate repairs needed. It will be used to keep our courts in excellent playing condition and extend their useful life in a reasonable and cost-effective manner. He has plans to present his comprehensive plan to the SCA Board of Directors by the end of July.

The Villa turf removal project is continuing. High Mesa and Mountain View are just about completed. Additional rock may have to be added to some areas, but bushes and trees have been planted. There is an entirely new landscape for these Villa areas. If you have not seen the work that has been done, I encourage you to either walk or drive through these two areas so you can see the new landscape.

The Facilities and Landscaping Committee is recruiting new members to its committee. We are looking for members with landscaping experience or a strong interest in the area. We also welcome others with ideas in keeping Sun City Anthem one of the premier 55+ communities in the nation. If interested, please fill out a volunteer application at SCA-HOA.org.

We received good news with respect to the Sun City Anthem 2022 amended federal income tax return. As of May 27, 2024, the Internal Revenue Service had processed and approved that return

and will refund \$53,706.66, including interest of \$2,511.66. We expect them to approve SCA's 2021 amended federal income tax return by the time this article is published. As a reminder, the refund requested for that year was \$50,524, not including interest. These income tax refunds totaling \$101,719 are included in SCA's 2023 audited financial statements and are part of 2023's roughly \$633,000 main operating fund surplus.

The mandatory Villa turf and tree removal projects continue with Mountain View almost completed and Canyon Crest underway as of the Spirit Magazine article publication deadline. The total cost for all the neighborhoods will be significantly less than originally expected, so the Board voted to waive the Villa's third and fourth quarter special reserve assessments. In addition, Villa homeowners who paid their special reserve assessments in advance will receive a refund equal to those two quarterly assessments. As each neighborhood's project is completed, applications for rebates from the City of Henderson and the Southern Nevada Water Authority will be prepared and submitted.

Considering the numerous personnel changes in 2024, the capital projects already approved and in process, and those yet to start, the development of SCA's 2025 Budget will be more complex than in the past. One of the benefits of having new staff is they bring new ideas and a fresh set of eyes to our procedures. Similarly, having additional board members with significant business and financial backgrounds should allow us to provide more meaningful financial information to the community, both concerning the annual budget and our interim financial statements. For the 2025 budget timetable, go to the SCA Finance Committee webpage (from the main SCA webpage, click on *Governance*, then click on *Finance Committee*. Next go to Budget 2025 and scroll down to Budget Timeline/Budget Calendar.)

Our mission is to advise and assist Management and the Board Treasurer in successfully performing their duties. We conduct monthly reviews of SCA finances, undertake economic studies, and make recommendations on financial policies and reports presented to the SCA Board of Directors. As the complexity of SCA's needs continues to evolve, the Finance Committee could benefit by having a few additional qualified members join its ranks. Please review the background and experience requirements at scahoa.com/finance-committee and consider filling out a volunteer application.

Our monthly meetings are open to the public, where a current SCA financial update is presented by Management prior to its submission to the board. Residents are encouraged to attend these meetings to better understand the financial operations of the community. This is also the best time and place to ask detailed questions about SCA's financial activities.

Emergency Preparedness (EPSG)

Summer Twofer



'nder normal circumstances, a twofer can be a buyer's delight when the buyer has an offer to get two for the price of one. Applied to emergency preparedness, heat and loss of power may not offer the same buyer's intrigue. Over the past two years, Sun City Anthem has experienced several

power outages in multiple villages. Threat assessments warn of possible cyberattacks affecting the power grid. A power outage in extreme heat may not be the deal you are looking for, but should be prepared for, nonetheless.

Power outages can be planned or unanticipated. Deadly wildfires can be started from downed power lines in high winds. To reduce these risks, NV Energy and other power companies, may proactively turn off power to transmission lines in high winds. In extreme heat, power companies may initiate rolling blackouts to reduce the strain on the power grid. Damage to power poles, transformer failures, and power grid cyberattacks attacks can also cause unplanned disruptions in service. In SCA, several residents have power dependent medical devices, medications needing refrigeration, or are just more susceptible to the effects of extreme heat if air conditioners fail. These risks can be mitigated if early preparations are done. Here are some recommendations:

- For power-dependent medical devices, get an emergency power capable of powering your device until the power comes back on.
- For medications requiring refrigeration, plan for backup sources of cold such as extra ice cubes or reusable ice blocks and cooler.

- Assemble and recheck essential supplies. Obtain and store 3-5 days of non-perishable food, water, medications for you and your pets prior to any upcoming weather extremes.
- Use moistened breathable clothes, towels, even a shower to cool you down.
- Limit the number of times you open your refrigerator or freezer door.
- Lower shades to reduce the amount of heat into your rooms. If there is a breeze, open doors/windows to bring cooler air in. Consider battery operated fans.
- Keep your portable devices fully charged. Obtain a battery powered cellphone charger backup.
- If your WiFi is out, turn off your cellphone's WiFi as the phone will use more power searching for a WiFi network.
- Locate any gas/propane portable generator outdoors and at least 20 feet away from building openings to prevent carbon monoxide gas from entering.
- Unplug appliances and electronics to avoid damage from electrical surges when the power comes back on.
- Make sure your vehicle's gas tank has plenty of fuel before predicted extreme weather events in case there's a power outage and you need to shelter in another location.
- Know locations you can evacuate to if power outage is extended. Consider a plan with locations such as casinos where they may have emergency power to operate. Keep

in mind, emergency shelters may not be open unless there is a widespread outage. Also consider friends and family who live outside the area that may have power that you could

While we can't predict power outages, we can be prepared for them.

Services Provided by Sun City Anthem Volunteer Residents for Sun City Anthem Residents.

The mission of the Community Service Committee (CSC) is to provide limited home maintenance, delivery of durable medical equipment for short-term loan, transportation services, external resources contact information, and support groups to assist residents to maintain their independence and to live in their own homes for as long as possible.



How Can We Help You?

Residents can request CSC's services by using our website, **CSCHelp4U.org**, seven days a week, or by calling our Assistance Line, **702-614-5862**. Clearly state your telephone number when leaving messages on CSC's Assistance Line and ensure availability for CSC to leave messages on your answering machine. As a reminder, your SCA Activity Card number will be needed to request services.

- Our *Medical Equipment* team maintains and delivers durable medical equipment for short-term loan including canes, crutches, wheelchairs, walkers, shower chairs, and more.
- The *Home Maintenance* team performs certain tasks that residents may not be able to safely do themselves, such as replacing batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms, light bulbs, house address bulbs, HVAC filters, adding salt to water softeners, and lubricating garage doors.
- CSC's Transportation team provides, with certain parameters, rides locally to healthcare appointments, pharmacies, grocery stores, and all SCA community centers.
- Support Groups provide residents and their families and friends with a forum to share individual experiences, concerns, challenges, and successes. Check the SCA weekly Community Chronicles eBlast for dates, times, and locations.
- Our Communications team maintains the Assistance Line and connects residents and their requests with the appropriate service and/or support groups.
- Resources maintains a list of a variety of fee-based service vendors and their contact information. CSC does not recommend or endorse any business, person, or service.
- The *Public Relations* role focuses on informing you of CSC's activities through SCA's weekly *Community Chronicles*, monthly *Spirit*, and via collateral materials, such as brochures, pamphlets, and fliers.

Limiting the Crime Triangle

he Crime Triangle is composed of three parts: ability, desire, and opportunity. Unfortunately, there is little we can do as a society regarding a person's ability or desire to commit a crime. However, if we limit, restrict, or even eliminate the opportunity, then we can reduce their desire and ability, making the crime more difficult to commit.

The best example is garages. It appears more and more residents have so much "stuff" that gets stored in the garage they have no choice but to park their vehicle outside. What is so valuable in those boxes that you would rather keep your \$50,000+ vehicle outside? By keeping your car in your garage, you have eliminated the opportunity, thus taking away a criminal's desire and ability.

Recently, a new threat has arisen where cars are being broken into and the garage door openers and registration stolen. The criminals

ABILITY **CRIME OPPORTUNITY** will quickly drive to the residence and use the garage door opener to get access to the residence. One victim was recently taken for \$80,000. Henderson Police Department recently arrested an individual who successfully burglarized many homes after getting the registration and garage door opener.

There is a simple step to prevent the opportunity by removing your name and address from your registration and insurance paperwork if left in your vehicle. You can use an Exacto knife to cut your name and address out. Another option is to whiteout your name and address, make a photocopy, whiteout the area again on the copied form and then make another photocopy. Remember, your registration has your name and address on it twice so be sure to remove/conceal both. Do not simply use a Sharpie pen. When held up to the light personal information can still be viewed. Do not just use whiteout. Once dried, the whiteout can be picked off.

It is not against the law to do this. For one, there is no law preventing it. We have confirmed this with HPD. Second, law enforcement has advanced so much that many agencies use scanners that can read the QR strip on the registration to get the necessary information or officers can run your plate to get the same.

Be sure not to leave anything else in the glove box that has your address. Many people leave the warranty for their tires in their glove box which usually has your name and address on it. Lock your glove box as an added measure. Don't forget always, even if at home, to lock your door in the garage that gives access to the residence.

There is enough anxiety when somebody breaks into your car. By taking these steps, you are eliminating the opportunity to have a second crime committed on your property.

Until next month, stay vigilant.



Fullness Signals



Fullness is the body's way of indicating it has had enough food. However, external factors like portion sizes or social settings can make these cues easy to miss. Here are some strategies to help:

• Eat Mindfully: Pay attention to the experience of eating, including the colors, smells, textures, and flavors of food.

- Slow Down: It takes about 20 minutes for your brain to register fullness.
- Check-in With Yourself: Pause during meals to assess your hunger and fullness. A handy tool is the 'Hunger-Fullness Scale', which ranges from 1 (starving) to 10 (stuffed). Aim to eat when you are at a 3 or 4 and stop around a 6 or 7.
- **Hydrate:** Our body often mistakes thirst for hunger. Stay hydrated throughout the day.
- **Prioritize Satisfaction:** Choose satisfying foods. Enjoying your meal makes it less likely you will overeat.
- **Do Not Skip:** Missed meals or an irregular eating schedule will make it more difficult to notice your fullness cues.

Remember, these cues vary for everyone, and it takes time to learn them, so be patient. By recognizing your body's fullness cues, you are fostering a healthier relationship with food.

A Registered Dietitian can help you understand how to make important decisions about nutrition and supplementation. The screening of documentaries Going Home and Crossing Donner Summit on May 18 attracted over 80 attendees. CHC President David Chan explained that the films were a cooperative effort of Nevada Chinese Association and CHC. He then introduced the producer Min Zhou who briefly explained the filmmaking process.

Crossing Donner Summit

The first film Crossing Donner Summit showcased the rugged Sierra Nevada Mountains. Narrated by many railroad workers and residents, it revealed the challenges of constructing this treacherous section. Initially, the hiring of Chinese railroad workers faced resistance. However, due to lack of interest from White workers and the capability demonstrated by the initial Chinese crew, about 15,000 to 20,000 Chinese railroad workers were eventually employed. These workers received lower wages for the same job than their White counterparts and were assigned the most difficult and dangerous work including tunnelling and explosives.

Going Home

The second film *Going Home* tells the story about how the people of Carlin, a remote town in the Nevada deep desert, welcomed back 13 Chinese workers' remains, which had been exiled for 22 years. The residents in Carlin honored these Chinese railroad worker as "the oldest citizens of our town." The driving force

behind this achievement is Li Zhu Wang, a Carlin Chinese restaurant owner. With the help of her friends, she spent more than 20 years pursuing the return of the remains to their original home. She was present at the screening of the documentaries.

Both films were well-received by the attendees.

All these topics are opinion topics, and that is what we are: an opinion club. Since opinions can and do vary widely, we have rules designed to encourage participation and keep the discussions on point. These rules include a reminder that our meetings are for information and entertainment, that all opinions are encouraged and welcome, and will be respected, and civility and politeness are expected. This is important as we do our best to respect the opinions of all.

We continue with our speakers forum as well. The forum allows club members who have a particular knowledge in an area to highlight their expertise by doing a presentation to the club. Upcoming topics include:

Climate Change: An Alternative View Journalism vs. History What is Science? USA & Mexico Relations

We meet on Monday mornings and Thursday afternoons. On Mondays we start with sports. This gives members a chance to brag (or lament) about their favorite school or hometown team or a sports incident that has caught their attention. On Thursdays we start with what happened that week in history. Next come "flips," which are short statements regarding an issue you may like (flip up) or dislike (flip down).

DEMOCRATIC CLUB

The SCA Democratic Club supports the right to affordable healthcare, a woman's reproductive rights, voting rights, minority rights, and the right to a more equitable society. The club invites speakers each month on a variety of topics and offers educational and advocacy opportunities.

The Democratic, Republican, Lifelong Learning and Current Events clubs recently co-sponsored a panel discussion on Nevada Ballot Question 3. The question asks whether the Nevada Constitution should be amended to allow for open primaries and ranked-choice voting (RCV) at general elections.

Open primaries would allow all registered voters to choose from among all the candidates running, regardless of party affiliation. The candidates who receive the most votes, up to a maximum of five, would move forward. RCV allows voters to rank the candidates in order of personal preference. To win, a candidate must receive 50% plus 1.

Steve Sebelius, with Channel 13 News, moderated the discussion. Dr. Sondra Cosgrove, a history professor at the College of Southern Nevada and the Executive Director and Chair of Vote Nevada, supports the amendment. She believes open primaries will offer voters more choices and RCV will encourage candidate outreach to all voters. Bradley Schrager, Esq., a voting rights attorney, opposes the amendment. He believes RCV campaigns will increase negative campaigning and complex ballots will result in more errors.

bipartisan-index-2023-118th-congress/). Senator Rosen reported that the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law has provided funding of \$3.5 billion for investment in Nevada roads, bridges, public transit, ports and airports, resulting in the creation of 140,000 new jobs. Roughly \$248 million has been announced for clean water and water infrastructure.

The Democratic Club encourages all its members to do everything in their power to help re-elect President Biden and Vice President Harris, and to re-elect Southern Nevada's incumbent congressional delegation, and help maintain the Democratic majorities in the Nevada State Legislature.


GARDEN CLUB

PHOTO CLUB

A tip for better photos—fill the frame. Let your main subject dominate the photo and leave little, if any space, around it. This is an easy way to simplify a photo. How do you do it?

- 1. Move closer to your subject.
- 2. If you can't move closer, use a telephoto lens or a "zoom" feature on your camera or cellphone.
- 3. In post-processing, lightly crop your photo to improve composition.
- 4. You also can fill the frame with "negative space" backgrounds that fade away and don't draw the viewer's eye. Examples are a stretch of sky, water, walls, sand, and blurred features. Using a wide aperture (small f/stop such as f/2.8) results in a shallow depth of field that blurs the

background. (See photo 3.) On a programmable camera, portrait mode can decrease the depth of field. On an iPhone, use portrait mode and tap the F button for the desired effect. Experiment with this composition technique and have fun.



SEWING & QUILTING

Club spotlight this month is on our Shared Interest Group, Loose Threads, and its thoughts on Quilting 101/Quilting 102.

When quilting, two very important things appear more relevant than in any other sewn item, the ¼ inch seam allowance and the fact that your fabric is always "pressed," never ironed like a sheet or pillowcase. Pressing the fabric is the up and down motion with the iron. Ironing tends to stretch out the fabric with the back-andforth motion on the fabric. This might result in a block that isn't square. Because this is only a quilting thing and a lot of members had a difficult time, the Quilting 101 classes were started in 2012 by past member, Joanne Williams.

Georgia Tobey and Donna Lyttle started teaching Quilting 101 in the Spring of 2014.

These two developed a team approach when teaching classes. Georgia likes to teach the color wheel and how fabrics go together. Donna loves to "nest" the seams together for beginners and then demos that on the sewing machine. Georgia is great at helping the members to square up their blocks and Donna loves the binding process. The next Quilting 101 series will be October 2 through November 6. Sewing Club members please visit the class section on our website to sign up for this series.

In this 6-week class, beginners will deal with how to cut fabric using the rotary cutter, how to choose colors/patterns, how to make three different 12-inch blocks, and how to put them together in a table runner. They will also finish with adding the backing, quilting the runner and then the final step – adding the binding.

Donna Lyttle, (also known as our historian), shared some facts:

- In 2005, Sharon Janssen presented the first Lottery Block.
- February 2006, Happy Hookers (knitting group) and Chicks with Sticks (crochet group) was formed, and these groups are now under Arts & Crafts.






