

Living Life at SCA: What It Takes

Keeping Informed

ctober is Cybersecurity Awareness Month. The Department of Homeland Security has a Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) that monitors and responds to cybersecurity threats in the U.S. CISA also provides educational materials to the public to help avoid threats.

Recent news stories about large and sophisticated casino and healthcare companies that were hacked have demonstrated that none of us is immune to the damage a cyberattack can unleash. At the August board meeting our director of technology, Richard James, spoke about testing SCA's systems to make sure our vulnerabilities are minimized. To renew our cybersecurity insurance, professionals conducted penetration testing of our systems.

Some vulnerabilities were identified and immediately addressed. But the testing revealed we all need to do our part to make sure our data is as safe and secure as possible. Training is already planned for our employees and board members.

"Secure Our World" is CISA's theme for Cybersecurity Awareness Month, and CISA.gov has recommendations for each of us to build a safer digital world. Most important are recognizing and reporting phishing, using strong passwords and multifactor authentication, and updating software.

Phishing aims to steal private and confidential information by sending sham emails that look like they are from a reputable company that you

may have a relationship with. The email asks you to click on a link to confirm information such as passwords or security questions.

Sometimes the emails say they are contacting you about a delivery, or an order you supposedly placed for goods or services, or suspicious activity in your account. If you receive an unsolicited email or text from a financial institution or business you deal with, don't respond - that's how they get you. If you are concerned that the email might be valid, contact the "sender" through a phone number you know to be authentic.

Strong passwords are key to keeping information secure. A strong password should be unique and long, include random letters and numbers, and not be used for multiple website logins.

Multifactor authentication is a system by which you receive an email or text asking you to confirm your identity. This prevents hackers from taking over your accounts, but those who wish to do harm have become increasingly sophisticated and sometimes able to thwart this system. Be alert to something that doesn't look right; call your cellphone provider directly if you are in doubt about the authenticity of an unsolicited email or text message that you receive.

Updating software is something that should be set to happen automatically. Companies are continuously responding to the threats of sophisticated hackers who exploit vulnerabilities.

The Computer Club at SCA can provide technical assistance and education on all aspects of computers and online safety. Often the club schedules seminars for residents on various topics of interest. Be sure to read the club's articles every month in this magazine.



Interim Chief Operating Officer Report





Hello residents!

As summer winds down and we kick off the fall season I want to address the water savings we have collectively saved in our community. We are responsible for 140 acres of landscape and water. In 2018 between the neighborhoods, common areas, and facilities we used 102,048,892 gallons of water for the year. With a focus on reducing water usage, we have

achieved extreme results, using 52,591,132 gallons in 2023. This represents a 48% decrease in water consumption!

How did we achieve such success in reducing water usage?

- Reduction and removal of 256,390 square feet or almost six acres of grass.
- Replacement of trees and shrubs with water-smart plants that require less water. Known as zeroscaping or tropical scape, this practice not only adds color to our landscape but also plays a key role in water preservation.
- Implementing an irrigation technique by placing a ring of irrigation tubing around the trunk of the tree. This method has proven to be healthier for the tree and requires much less water.
- Utilizing technology to manage our water consumption. SmartLink Water Controller system allows us to continuously monitor the status of each valve and sprinkler, collecting data on water usage. Additionally, the valves and sprinklers can be monitored from a central location for correct and timely watering cycles. This allows for more efficiency in managing

our water. It offers valuable information on how to upkeep our landscape effectively by ensuring that maintenance schedules are adhered to.

Holiday Decorating and Lighting

- Exterior decorations and lighting appropriate for holidays may be displayed 30 days prior to and 30 days after the holiday.
- Flickering lights are allowed as part of a holiday's decoration.
- Decorations celebrating the onset of a season may be kept until the end of the month following the onset day.
- Decorations observing the holiday season, including, but not limited to Hanukkah, Christmas, Kwanzaa, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Independence Day, New Year's Eve, and the Spring Festival (Chinese New Year) may be displayed 30 days prior to a holiday and must be taken down 30 days after the holiday.

How to submit your request

To make ARC approval as painless as possible and in lieu of homeowners attending the ARC meetings, residents can email their applications and plans to ARC-Committee@scacai.com, or send them by UPS or mail, or drop them off at one of the lockboxes located outside of all our centers. To facilitate the processing of your project, we now only require one copy of your submittal; once received, it will be reviewed at the next scheduled meeting and the results will be mailed/emailed back to the homeowner.

If you are submitting plans for review, **please sign and date the site plan** and be available by phone during the plan review time as listed above. If you will not be available at the listed phone number, it is very important that you submit a phone number where you may be reached during this time period. Be aware that the ARC member may be calling you from an area code other than 702, so you should answer all incoming calls during the plan review period. If you cannot be reached by phone, they will reject your project or return your submitted paperwork by mail or email with a request for further information and your project will not be revisited until the next scheduled meeting.

An ARC member will perform a final site check approximately 90 days after approval of your project to verify adherence to the approved plans.

This committee is responsible for imposing fines and/or sanctions. Following a hearing before the Covenants Committee, the alleged violator has the right to appeal the decision to the Board. Covenants meetings are not open to residents unless invited.

On July 30, Board Treasurer Forrest Quinn presented an initial draft of the 2025 operating budget at a Resident Workshop. There were several insightful questions asked by residents, both in-person and online. Further analysis is required in the major expense areas that were identified. Since that date, the Finance Committee has had many meetings with management and the board liaisons to address resident concerns as well as those of the committee members.

As part of our budget responsibilities, the Finance Committee expressed concerns about the assumptions being used for payroll and benefits, utilities, insurance expenses, block wall repairs and remediation expenses, landscape maintenance expenses for the Villas and Pinnacle and the continuing funding of losses for the Yorktown Grill. We delved deeper into the funding level and planned expenditures from our Reserve Funds, including the Villas and Pinnacle. At the request of Forrest Quinn, the 2025 budget will also reflect many more details on departmental expenses than the budgets of the past few years have shown. This will allow for enhanced internal management and performance evaluation of all staff members.

According to the board approved 2025 Budget Calendar, the above concerns were scheduled to have been addressed and the budget adopted by the board at the September 26 meeting. The annual budget calendar includes adoption by the board in September to allow time for printing and distribution to residents before SCA's required Annual Membership and Budget Ratification Meeting which is held in November.

Sun City Anthem's 2023 federal income tax return is due on October 15, and SCA recently finalized the information required for Frazier & Deeter, our outside CPA firm, to prepare a draft 2023 tax return for review before the actual tax return is filed. They are also following up with the IRS on the status of the refund SCA is owed from its amended 2021 tax return as that has not yet been received.

Our monthly meetings are open to the public, where a current SCA financial update is presented by management prior to its submission to the board. Residents are encouraged to attend these meetings to better understand the financial operations of the community. This is also the best time and place to ask detailed questions about SCA's financial activities.

If you are using professional help, please warn your gardener not to blow leaves and debris onto the neighboring yards or the street but instead collect them for bulk trash pick-up days. Remove weeds, trim all vegetation encroaching into the neighbors, check the irrigation system, fertilize, etc. Ask permission from your neighbors if your landscaper needs access to their yard to do the work or collect any trimmings that might have fallen onto their lots.

Most homeowners prefer not to report on their neighbors. elcome back to fall and cooler weather. I doubt any of us will forget this past summer and the recordbreaking heat. I am sure you will also remember the occasional power failures in SCA and elsewhere around the city.

Imagine a scenario where a prolonged power failure occurs. Even though our utilities are underground, they are still susceptible to accidental (or purposeful) damage that takes place above ground level. The cell towers would be immediately overwhelmed as most residents have given up landlines. Very few residents have generators.

Certain residents require power for medical equipment. They should have backup batteries for the short term. It is also suggested they register with NV Energy, so their needs are prioritized and communicated to the City of Henderson.

SCA is fortunate to have dedicated residents participating in our community Emergency Preparedness Service Group. This committee focuses on preparing for events like power failures, which should not happen but obviously can. One of the main goals is to communicate residents' needs to the City of Henderson, primarily through radio.

Emergency Preparedness needs radio operators. If you are one, they need you. If you are not one, you can easily learn by attending a SCA Amateur Radio Club sponsored class, passing an easy exam, and obtaining a radio for under \$100. There is even an app you can use on your cellphone.

If this is not your forte, there are other volunteer opportunities available for everyone to contribute to the betterment of our community. Read the weekly Chronicles for current immediate needs.

Volunteer applications can be filled out online or picked up from the membership office. Completed applications can be dropped off in the Volunteer Coordinator mailbox at the entrance to the Anthem Fitness Center or emailed to volunteer@scacai.com.

Emergency Preparedness (EPSG)

Di-Di-Dah-Dah-Dah-Di-Dit



ome of you may recognize this as Morse code to spell out SOS. In 1844 the first Morse code was sent out and became a lifeline for ships going across the ocean to call for help with the first transatlantic amateur radio transmission occurring in 1923. While amateur radio has evolved into smaller

yet more advanced technology, one of its missions from the early days of providing communications in an emergency has not wavered.

What does this history lesson have to do with emergency preparedness? In areas of the world where earthquakes, hurricanes, tornados, and other disasters have resulted in the loss or disruption of traditional communications, amateur radio was repeatedly used to help coordinate disaster relief activities. In Las Vegas, the widespread belief that it is not a matter of if, but when an event will disrupt our communications.

In a significant emergency or disaster, it is expected that both cellular phones and landlines will either be immediately overwhelmed or inoperable due to damage or power outages. As witnessed in the disasters discussed above, the ability for communitywide assistance may be delayed due to communication failures. These delays can be compounded as many of us have given up our landlines, making us dependent on cellular phones that can fail in an emergency. Over the past six months, SCA residents have experienced several power outages, and a minor earthquake. Many are becoming aware that Las Vegas is an island

when it comes to resources and communication. Amateur radio has demonstrated resilience in challenging times.

Amateur radio has evolved in two critical areas. First, is the ease of getting a license. The second is the cost. Now, to become licensed you do not need to be a "techno-geek" and spend a fortune on equipment. You can attend a class, pass an easier exam, and obtain a radio for as low as \$50. There is even an app you can use on your cellphone instead of getting a radio.

With many of us retired and seeking community involvement, amateur radio not only allows exploring modes of communication from the comfort of our homes but enhances SCA's capability to be self-reliant in an emergency. Amateur radios can be our lifeline to communicate resident needs within SCA and extend our communications to governmental and non-governmental agencies hopefully getting aid quicker to our residents.

Please consider joining the SCA Amateur Radio Club and Emergency Preparedness Service Group, getting a license, and expanding your community involvement. This will help us be better prepared for situations where traditional communications are disrupted.

Community Service

Services Provided by Sun City Anthem Volunteer Residents for Sun City Anthem Residents

The mission of the Community Service Committee (CSC) is to provide limited home maintenance, delivery of durable medical equipment for short-term loan, transportation services, external resources contact information, and support groups to assist residents to maintain their independence and to live in their own homes for as long as possible.



How Can We Help You?

Residents can request CSC's services by using our website, CSCHelp4U.org, seven days a week, or by calling our Assistance Line, (702) 614-5862. Clearly state your telephone number when leaving messages on CSC's Assistance Line and ensure availability for CSC to leave messages on your answering machine. As a reminder, your SCA Activity Card number will be needed to request services.

- Our *Medical Equipment* team maintains and delivers durable medical equipment for short-term loan including canes, crutches, wheelchairs, walkers, shower chairs, and more.
- The *Home Maintenance* team performs certain tasks that residents may not be able to safely do themselves, such as replacing batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms, light bulbs, house address bulbs, HVAC filters, adding salt to water softeners, and lubricating garage doors.
- CSC's *Transportation* team provides, with certain parameters, rides locally to healthcare appointments, pharmacies, grocery stores, and all SCA community centers.
- Support Groups provide residents and their families and friends with a forum to share individual experiences, concerns, challenges, and successes. Check the SCA weekly **Community Chronicles** eBlast for dates, times, and locations.
- Our *Communications* team maintains the Assistance Line and connects residents and their requests with the appropriate service and/or support groups.
- Resources maintains a list of a variety of fee-based service vendors and their contact information. CSC does not recommend or endorse any business, person, or service.
- The **Public Relations** role focuses on informing you of CSC's activities through SCA's weekly **Community Chronicles**, monthly **Spirit**, and via collateral materials, such as brochures, pamphlets, and fliers.

Once again, we are asking every resident to make sure the Community Patrol has your phone number in our Reverse Directory. The patrol would like to have the phone number of every SCA resident. This way we can contact you if we see something at your home that needs attention. Such as water leaks, open garage doors, or emergency lights flashing. We can even help get lost pets back to their owners. The information provided is private, confidential, and is shared with NO ONE.

Some of us old-timers who have lived in SCA for many years may think the patrol automatically has their phone number. That may not be the case. Just because you have given your phone number to the Neighborhood Watch or the SCA Resident Directory does not mean it is listed with Community Patrol. The only way your phone number is added to our listing is by coming to our patrol office and filling out the Reverse Directory form. Another way might have been at a newcomer meeting or a neighborhood watch gathering and filling out the form at the event. These are the only ways that Community Patrol gets your information.

In our community, we have 7,144 homes. The patrol has contact information for approximately 73% or 5,215 homes. That means 1,928 homes are not listed.

One way to make sure your home is not one of the unlisted is to stop by the patrol office and ask our dispatcher on duty to check for your address.

In 2023, the patrol made 506 calls to our residents for issues needing their attention. So far this year we made 402 calls. The patrol office is located in the Anthem Center parking lot between the bocce court and the tennis courts. The patrol office is open seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Neighborhood Watch (NWSC)



Neighborhood Watch Fall Safety Event

ark your calendars! The SCA Neighborhood Watch Fall Safety event will be on Wednesday, October 2, in the Grand Ballroom from 10 to 11:30 a.m. There will be presentations by Henderson Chief of Police Hollie Chadwick, an exhibition by the HPD K-9 Unit, a SWAT vehicle display, and a presentation on the new HPD West Henderson Inspirada Substation. You will need to RSVP for this event, so contact your Neighborhood Watch Block Captain or Village Facilitator. The video of the similar May 17 event is available on YouTube, just search for the SCA NW Spring Safety Event.

Crime Statistics

Through August 2024 we had 11 burglaries or attempted burglaries, most of which had the same methodology:

- Break-ins usually occur between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.
- The homeowner is away for only a brief time, as little as 15 minutes, indicating burglars were watching the home. Burglars are usually in and out in under 5 minutes.
- The break-in is through the front door. A crowbar is commonly used. Occasionally, the security screen door or front door was unlocked.
- The master bedroom closet was ransacked. Stolen items included cash, jewelry, guns, and credit cards. In one case, \$16,000 in cash was among the items taken.
- No video surveillance was available because the owner did not have a functioning video doorbell.
- The break-ins were widespread, happening in Black Mountain, Meadow Vista, Mountain View, Shadow Canyon, and Valley View.

Precautions to Consider

- Be alert to strange cars or people who may be watching when you leave your home. Double back if suspicious, but do not confront! Call 911 if a crime is in progress and call 311 if there is suspicious activity.
- Secure your front door with a security screen door, long screws through the strike plate, or use an inside door jammer. And lock the doors!
- Have a functioning video doorbell that alerts you when someone is at the front door and can record if a break-in occurs. Join the HPD CAPTURE program to help HPD solve crimes.
- · Do not keep valuables accessible, especially in the master bedroom or closet. Store them in a secure safe or hide them in an inconspicuous place.
- Request that the Henderson PD do a Home Security Survey by calling 702-267-5100 or by sending an email to neighborhoodwatch@cityofhenderson.com to schedule one. We guarantee Officer Alex Alcantara will have great ways to improve your home security.

If you cannot reach them, contact the SCA Community Patrol at 702-614-6751 to see if the home is in their Reverse Directory.







The Anthem Authors Club has two members with newly published books this month. Both are highly recommended.


My Name Is Jimmy, by Iris Hattersley

Mid-Autumn Festival and mooncakes

Mooncakes are a type of food with a history dating back more than three thousand years ago in China. Originally, they were a plain, flat, round flour pastry. During the Han dynasty (100 BC), sesame and nuts were imported from the Persian Gulf to China. Fillings were added, and the cakes were renamed hu cake since hu means foreign. Hu cake was renamed mooncake during the Tang (700 AD) dynasty. Today, mooncakes come in a variety of fillings, with the most common being nuts and bean paste, jujube paste, and lotus paste.

The tradition of eating mooncakes on the 15th day of the eighth lunar moon began during the Ming dynasty. At the end of the Yuan dynasty (1300 AD), the ruling regime was cruel to the people leading to many revolutionary groups rising across the country.



One leader and his strategist devised a plan to pass information using mooncakes. They hid the messages inside the mooncakes and spread the rumor that eating mooncakes on the night of the 15th day of the eighth lunar moon would bring good luck to the family. Different revolutionary groups connected through this method and eventually overthrow the Yuan regime. The emperor of the new Ming dynasty established

the tradition of mooncakes for the 15th day of the eighth lunar

Athar Haseebullah, Esq., the Executive Director of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) spoke to the club recently about Project 2025 and answered questions from attendees. The document makes approximately 334 unique policy recommendations that will significantly reshape the federal government if implemented.

For example, the document recommends the abolishment of the Department of Education, the dismantling of the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), substantive changes to the Department of Justice and other Federal departments and agencies, and the reclassification of approximately 50,000 civil servants who could then be fired and replaced with political appointees.

The mission of Project 2025 is "... to alter the balance of power by increasing the president's authority over every part of the federal government that now operates, by either law or tradition, with any measure of independence from political interference ..." The New York Times, July 18, 2023.

Kamala Harris believes that the Project 2025 agenda poses an ... "existential danger ... to American democracy, freedom, and the middle class." The Hill, August 28, 2024.

The club's leadership team encourages all its members to do everything in their power to help elect Vice President Harris and Governor Tim Walz as the next President and Vice President, and to re-elect Southern Nevada's congressional delegation - Senator Jacky Rosen, Congresswoman Dina Titus, Congresswoman Susie Lee, and Congressman Steven Horsford. It is also important to help maintain the Democratic majorities in the Nevada State Legislature and to vote in down ballot races - for example, Dr. Tricia Braxton, candidate for NV State Board of Education, District 1. As the old saying goes, all politics is local, and these races matter to us and the children of Nevada.

DUPLICATE BRIDGE

Why do people enjoy playing bridge? Bridge is the perfect balance of fun and logic. As we age, it is important to challenge our brains.

Duplicate bridge is a competitive form of bridge in which the same hands are played successively by different partnerships. In other words, a single hand of bridge is "duplicated" so it can be played a dozen or more times in a session of bridge.

Duplication of hands takes the luck of the cards out of play, thus providing fair competition. When you and your partner play a hand that is subsequently played by a dozen other pairs, the resulting range of scores represents a true picture of the relative skill of all the pairs playing that hand and "the luck of the cards" is eliminated.


GARDEN CLUB

What are Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur?

Rosh Hashanah (October 2 to 4) and Yom Kippur (October 11 and 12) are the holiest days of the Jewish year. Called the "High Holy Days," they are not celebratory but are times for selfreflection and prayer.

Rosh Hashanah, which means "Head of the Year," commemorates the beginning of the world and the creation of man and woman. Its customs include attending synagogue services, blowing the shofar (a ram's horn), and festive meals with symbolic foods such as apples dipped in honey to evoke a sweet new year.

Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, is a day of repentance for one's sins, along with fasting and prayer.

PHOTO CLUB

Wind, long exposures, and shaky hands can cause motion that blurs your photos. This month we have suggestions to help steady your shots:

- Hold your camera or cell phone with both hands and keep your elbows close to your body for stability. If you have a viewfinder, use it to stabilize your camera even more. If practical, brace yourself against a tree, a wall, or any stable surface for increased support.
- Today, many cameras and smartphones have a built-in image stabilization feature. Enable this, if available.
- A tripod or monopod can also significantly reduce camera shake. When using a tripod in windy conditions, remove your camera strap. It catches the wind and sways, pulling your camera and adding unexpected blur.
- To help counteract shaky hands increase the shutter speed or use a burst mode, available on some cameras and cellphones. Taking shots in quick succession increases the chances of getting a clear shot.

Now it is up to you. Practice holding your camera steady and trying some of our tips.



If you're skittish and a little intimidated by the word "strategy" don't be! We have an informal mentoring system, where members teach other members and take newbies under their wings.

One of the club's most popular games is CASCADIA. It ranks #1 in the top-abstract-games list and #6 in the top-family-games list at boardgamegeek.com, the most popular board game reference website.

Cascadia is a multi-award-winning tile-laying and token-drafting game featuring the habitats and wildlife of the Pacific Northwest. You take turns building out your own terrain and populating it

with wildlife. Each tile depicts one to three types of wildlife from the five types in the game, and you can place at most one wildlife token on a habitat.

On a turn, choose a habitat tile that is paired with a wildlife token, then place that tile next to your other ones and place the wildlife token on an appropriate habitat. Four tiles are on display, with each tile being paired at random with a wildlife token, so you must make the best of what is available — unless you have a nature token to spend so that you can pick your choice of each item.

Ideally you can place habitat tiles to create matching terrain that reduces fragmentation and creates wildlife corridors, mostly because you score for the largest area of each type of habitat at the game's end. At the same time, you want to place wildlife tokens so that you can maximize the number of points scored by them, with the wildlife goals being determined at random by one of the four scoring cards for each type of wildlife. Maybe hawks want to be separate from other hawks, while foxes want lots of different animals surrounding them and bears want to be in pairs. Can you make it happen?

Cascadia is a gorgeous game with a relaxing vibe that's easy to learn and offers plenty of replay value. A great pick for families and nature lovers.

Come to one of our club's three weekly sessions, and we'll teach you how to play Cascadia or any of our other games. We meet in Liberty Center on Saturdays and Mondays from 1 to 5 p.m., and Thursdays starting at 5 p.m. Our dues are \$7 but come try us out for free. Come at the beginning of the session, and stay for one game, two or more! We are a collegial group that just wants to have fun, and we look forward to meeting you.



Our September speaker was Captain Norm Scott, USN (retired). He treated us to a great presentation on Project Healing Waters (PHW) Fly Fishing, Inc. This program began in 2005 serving wounded military service members at Walter Reed Army Medical Center after they returned from combat duty in Iraq and Afghanistan. Have a seat

What's great about Woodchips Woodworking Club? If something is made of wood, it probably can be made in our shop. Our members have

been building quality projects usually at a fraction of the price

to buy. It is not just the cost savings, but also the satisfaction of building something with your own hands. This article features the work of members making chairs for their homes.

When we make something, we can add a personal touch. Gary Means built his chair with a clever dual-cup holder. In addition to making a beautiful and comfortable chair, it includes a builtin holder for a flat-bottomed glass or cup. Notice the hole with a slot? This allows a wine glass stem to slip through and have the bulb supported by the wooden frame. Coffee in the morning, wine in the evening.

What about our grandchildren when they come to visit? They want to sit by grandpa and need a chair too. Why not make a chair for the grandchild that matches grandpa's? That is just what Carmelo Beley built, a scaled-down chair for his grandson. Just remember, children do grow.

Teo Oruc wanted a set of high-quality chairs for his patio. When shopping around, he found that mahogany chairs were quite expensive. Teo is not only a master woodworker, but also a skilled carver. Making the chairs he wanted required countless hours of labor. Teo hewed the wood into the smooth, tapered sculptured shape he envisioned. The pieces were assembled with dowels for a secure and lasting joint. This is not just a chair, but a work of art.


