

Living Life at SCA: What It Takes **HOA Dues Comparisons**

he SCA Board of Directors approved the 2025 budget at its monthly meeting on September 26, with a scheduled homeowners ratification meeting to be held on November 21 at 5:30 p.m. in Freedom Hall. In line with the CC&Rs, the budget will be approved unless 90 percent of residents vote against it. Details about the budget and meeting agenda will be mailed to each homeowner before the meeting.

For 2025, annual assessments will increase by 2.6 percent amounting to \$1,785 annually, which breaks down to \$446 per quarter or \$149 monthly. The purpose of the budget is to maintain the value and lifestyle of our community. The BOD has been transparent about how these assessments have been allocated over the past year. We have used this Board Corner article to communicate what your annual assessment pays for.

Comparing SCA's assessments to other 55+ communities is challenging due to several factors:

- 1. Geographical scope. Should comparisons include just the Las Vegas valley or extend to areas like Mesquite, Arizona and Southern California?
- 2. Size of communities. How can we compare SCA with smaller 55+ communities that have fewer than 2,000 homes?

- 3. Amenities. Communities differ in the number and types of amenities (e.g., clubhouses, swimming pools, sports courts, golf courses), making comparisons complex.
- 4. Other features. Features like gated access add costs such as maintaining roads and gates, which may not be present in non-gated communities.

Our research shows that comparisons are complicated. In smaller communities like Solera, MacDonald Ranch, and Aliante, assessments range from \$79 to \$139 per month. Larger communities similar to SCA can range from \$149 to \$350 per month, with Summerlin over \$200. Sun City Festival in Buckeye, AZ, a comparable community, is \$168 per month.

Each of you undoubtedly looked at lots of communities before you moved here. The decision you made was likely based on the totality of what each community offered. Ultimately, the board believes the proposed 2025 assessment reflects the value SCA offers to homeowners to maintain and enhance the community's amenities and property values.



Holiday Schedule

During November and December, the Architectural Review Committee will meet only on the second Thursday of the month. We will be dark on the fourth Thursday of these months in observance of the holidays. Keep this in mind when submitting your architectural change applications.

All exterior modifications, upgrades, and improvements require written ARC approval prior to starting any project. We strongly encourage homeowners to review the Design Guidelines and the Rules and Regulations before submitting a request to modify their residence. You should get approval for your project before entering into a contract and placing a deposit with a contractor.

How to submit your request

To make ARC approval as painless as possible and in lieu of homeowners attending the ARC meetings, residents can email their applications and plans to ARC-Committee@scacai.com, or send them by UPS or mail, or drop them off at one of the lockboxes located outside of all our centers. To facilitate the processing of your project, we now only require one copy of your submittal; once received, it will be reviewed at the next scheduled meeting and the results will be mailed/emailed back to the homeowner.

If you are submitting plans for review, please sign and date the site plan and be available by phone during the plan review time as listed above. If you will not be available at the listed phone number, it is very important that you submit a phone number where you may be reached during this time period.

Be aware that the ARC member may be calling you from an area code other than 702, so you should answer all incoming calls during the plan review period. If you cannot be reached by phone, they will reject your project or return your submitted paperwork by mail or email with a request for further information and your project will not be revisited until the next scheduled meeting.

An ARC member will perform a final site check approximately 90 days after approval of your project to verify adherence to the approved plans.

The board of directors, as required in Article 5.2 of the Bylaws, established a Deed Restriction Enforcement Committee. At Sun City Anthem, this committee is called Covenants.

The Covenants Committee is the hearing tribunal of the Association and conducts hearings pursuant to Section 3.26 of the Bylaws and Article 7.4 of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions.

Hearings are normally scheduled once a month. Should you have any questions, please contact Compliance@SCACAI.com. A hearing is scheduled when a case cannot be resolved during the enforcement process.

The Covenants Committee hearing tribunal reviews the information regarding an alleged violation and determines whether a violation of the standards set forth in the Governing Documents occurred. This committee is responsible for imposing fines and/or sanctions. Following a hearing before the Covenants Committee, the alleged violator has the right to appeal the decision to the Board. Covenants meetings are not open to residents unless invited.

The Finance Committee plays an important role in ensuring management and the board of directors get independent financial advice on complex issues that ultimately impact homeowner's wallets. Our mission is to assist the hard-working management team and essential full-time directors with objective data that makes significant spending decisions guided by fact, not by intuition. Rather than complain about fees and spending decisions after the fact, get involved in the process and help make the best possible use of SCA's resources by volunteering for the Finance Committee. The committee needs qualified, engaged members

to provide the level of support SCA deserves. Although we prefer CPAs or homeowners with advanced degrees in business, accounting, or finance, we welcome retired CFOs, engineers, operations managers, and others with a strong knowledge of financial management. We currently have six members and a desire to add more.

At our most recent meeting, the Finance Committee voted against recommending the board approve the 2025 draft budget for the association. At the board liaison's request, we recited our formal budget recommendations and concerns regarding the assumptions being used for payroll and benefits along with the need to hire a general manager capable of creating and leading an efficient organization and assigning the GM the responsibility and authority to make necessary personnel and organizational changes. We also believe that the Yorktown Grill projected loss for 2025 is understated in the draft budget and in need of adjustment.

These recommendations to the board are included in the September 26 board book. Additional discussion items included the funding level and planned expenditures from our reserve funds, including the Villas and Pinnacle. At the September 26 BOD meeting, the board voted to approve the 2025 draft budget without incorporating the Finance Committee's recommendations.

Sun City Anthem's 2023 federal income tax return was timely filed by the October 15 deadline. Frazier & Deeter, our outside CPA firm, is continuing to follow up with the IRS on the status of the refund SCA is owed from its amended 2021 tax return as that has not yet been received.

Our monthly meetings are open to the public, where a current SCA financial update is presented by management prior to its submission to the board. Residents are encouraged to attend these meetings to better understand the financial operations of the community. This is also the best time and place to ask detailed questions about SCA's financial activities.

Community Standards



any homeowners have supported their favorite candidates and ballot questions by displaying yard signs. We want to inform homeowners of the rules that will take effect after the election concludes as of Wednesday. November 6.

Rules & Regulations section 15.8, F

"Signs shall be removed within ten (10) days of the election in which the office, issue, or ballot question is decided consistent with City of Henderson ordinance." SCA homeowners are encouraged to take down the signs as soon as possible to avoid receiving a courtesy reminder notice and as a courtesy to their neighbors.

The political season is nearing its end, which also means the holiday season is fast approaching! Homeowners are welcome to show their holiday spirit through front, rear, and side yard decorations. We would like to remind the homeowners of the rules regarding exterior holiday decorating.

Rules & Regulations section 15.6.

"Exterior decorations and lighting appropriate for holidays may be displayed thirty (30) days before a holiday and must be taken down no later than thirty (30) days after the holiday. Flickering lights are allowed as part of a holiday's decorations. Decorations observing the holiday season, including but not limited to Hanukkah, Christmas, Kwanzaa, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Independence Day, New Year's Eve, and the Spring Festival (Chinese New Year), may be displayed 30 days before a holiday and must be taken down by 30 days after the holiday."

Also, as stated in Design Guidelines Section II(I), "Exterior Lighting shall not be installed in any location or such manner that the light will adversely impact neighboring properties."

Emergency Preparedness (EPSG)

Shut It Down



n everyday life or during emergencies, situations may arise that require you to take immediate action. The time to assess and implement simple actions such as turning off your electricity at the circuit breakers, water, or gas can prevent a small event from escalating into something disastrous. Always consult a licensed professional.

Electrical panels and circuits

Labeling all circuits in your electrical panel will reduce the risk of electrical shock by identifying energized circuits or outlets before touching an outlet or wire.

- · Circuit breaker testers allow identification of the circuit breaker from an electrical source.
- In case of an electrical fire, de-energizing an electrical circuit removes electricity as the source of the fire, enabling the fire to be extinguished using a standard fire extinguisher.
- · When turning off breakers, turn off each breaker before turning off the main breaker.

- When turning the power back on, turn on the main breaker first, then each breaker to prevent a surge.
- For security, consider a lock to your outside emergency disconnect so intruders cannot turn off the power from outside the house.

Water

Knowing how to turn off your water will reduce or stop water flow from bursting or leaking pipes.


- After turning off the water valve, commonly found in your garage, opening a couple of faucets will depressurize the line and reduce flow until the pressure is relieved.
- After turning off the water, verify shutoff by checking for flow inside the house and outside spigots.
- Also know how to access and turn off the street water valve using a 4-in-1 or similar tool in case the house valve fails. Be careful as little critters like to share space in the valve box.
- Consider a smart water shutoff valve that can automatically turn off the water main when a perceived water leak is detected. This can be augmented by strategically placed water leak sensors that alert you as well as automatically turn off the water when water reaches the sensor.

Gas lines

- Occasionally check your gas meter for leaks using a spray bottle filled with water and liquid dish soap.
- Spray the solution around the meter and adjoining pipes to look for bubbles. If bubbles are present, you smell rotten eggs or hear a hissing sound, you may have a gas leak.
- If you suspect a leak, SW Gas advises against turning off the gas. Instead, call 911 or 877-860-6020 to report the leak.
- In an emergency, should you decide to turn off the gas at the meter, use a non-sparking wrench (such as the 4-in-1 tool) to turn the valve from open to closed.
- If you need to turn off the gas for any reason, DO NOT turn it back on as it may create a hazard. Contact SW Gas or have a licensed professional turn it back on.

YouTube has many how-to videos demonstrating each of the above activities. Take the time to be a know-it-all now.

The mission of the Community Service Committee (CSC) is to provide limited home maintenance, delivery of durable medical equipment for short-term loan, transportation services, external resources contact information, and support groups to assist residents to maintain their independence and to live in their own homes for as long as possible.



How Can We Help You?

Residents can request CSC's services by using our website, CSCHelp4U.org, seven days a week, or by calling our Assistance Line, (702) 614-5862. Clearly state your telephone number when leaving messages on CSC's Assistance Line and ensure availability for CSC to leave messages on your answering machine. As a reminder, your SCA Activity Card number will be needed to request services.

- Our *Medical Equipment* team maintains and delivers durable medical equipment for short-term loan including canes, crutches, wheelchairs, walkers, shower chairs, and more.
- The *Home Maintenance* team performs certain tasks that residents may not be able to safely do themselves, such as replacing batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms, light bulbs, house address bulbs, HVAC filters, adding salt to water softeners, and lubricating garage doors.
- CSC's *Transportation* team provides, with certain parameters, rides locally to healthcare appointments, pharmacies, grocery stores, and all SCA community centers.
- Support Groups provide residents and their families and friends with a forum to share individual experiences, concerns, challenges, and successes. Check the SCA weekly **Community Chronicles** eBlast for dates, times, and locations.
- Our *Communications* team maintains the Assistance Line and connects residents and their requests with the appropriate service and/or support groups.
- Resources maintains a list of a variety of fee-based service vendors and their contact information. CSC does not recommend or endorse any business, person, or service.
- The **Public Relations** role focuses on informing you of CSC's activities through SCA's weekly **Community Chronicles**, monthly **Spirit**, and via collateral materials, such as brochures, pamphlets, and fliers.

Chief Chat



Throughout the year we have explored a variety of topics. This month's Chief Chat will serve as a refresher on some of those key items.

Volunteers. SCA has several service committees, and Community Patrol is one of them. These committees foster a safe environment for our community members. However, they cannot function without volunteers. Patrol needs a variety of volunteers, including drivers, walkers, bike riders, and dispatchers. We

invite you to visit our office any day of the week from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. You can reach us at 702-614-6751.

Reverse directory. This database lists the residents' contact information, name, phone number, and address. This enables us to get in touch with the homeowner when the need arises like open garage doors, water leaks, or flashing emergency lights.

Vacation house check. Patrol will check your home every day for the first 30 days and once a week during days 31 to 90. We walk around the house (if possible) looking for conditions like water leaks, newspapers still being delivered, windows/doors not locked, packages delivered, etc.

Outside lights help reduce crime, enhance safety, and help prevent accidents. Improved lighting deters potential offenders by increasing the risk that they may be seen or recognized. A burglar will be more likely to target a house where they can more successfully enter undetected.

Older adults are less likely to be victimized by crimes of violence than by being defrauded over the phone or by someone at the door. Here are three simple steps you can take to help make sure you are not one of those statistics:

- 1. Always look to see who's at the door. Get a video doorbell or surveillance camera.
- 2. Don't open the door, keep it closed and talk through the door.
- 3. Never purchase anything over the phone or give important information such as credit card number, banking information, or social security number to anyone if they call you.

Member of the Month



Our Member of the Month is Joni Palazzo. In 2018, Joni and her husband Steve moved to SCA from San Diego, where she worked for the US Navy. Once settled in SCA, Joni began working for a local gaming company where she was an IT director with a focus on cybersecurity. Joni enjoys volunteering for Patrol, explaining, "When I was fully retired, I wanted to get involved in the community. One of the opportunities that caught my eye was the Patrol. They provide many valuable services to SCA residents, including vacation house checks, patrolling our villages, reporting water leaks and open garage doors, and any issues that are out of the ordinary in the community.

"One day, I stopped by the office and was surprised to learn that there are several roles within the Patrol so volunteers can choose how they would like to contribute and that a volunteer is only asked to put in four hours per week. Patrol volunteers are free to take time off for travel or other commitments, which was perfect for me. Being part of the Patrol has allowed me to feel like an integral part of the SCA community and make a difference to residents every day, which gives me great satisfaction.

Neighborhood Watch (NWSC)



Scams Targeting Seniors

e usually think of Neighborhood Watch as related to home security and physical safety, but we face another risk as seniors - SCAMS. Did you know seniors are more likely to be the target of a scam than a robbery or burglary? Particularly over the phone or via phishing email/text. These fall into three primary categories: Social Security, Medicare, and bank scams. Below are some resources to help you learn how to protect yourself in these areas:

- Social Security. Go to ssa.gov/scam/prevention to learn how to protect yourself from social security scams.
- Medicare. Visit Medicare.gov to learn more about averting Medicare fraud and medical identity theft.
- Bank. Visit blog.popularbank.com/04-18-2024/protect-frombank-fraud-scams/ to find ways to prevent bank scams.

General precautions to consider

- Implement two-factor authorization (TFA) at Social Security, Medicare, your bank and credit cards, your IRA/ brokerage account provider, your doctor, or anywhere else that provides it. This service will send a text code to your cell phone to verify it is really you before allowing anyone access to your information.
- Use strong passwords, and do not use the same password for everything. Google or Apple can remember the passwords for you.
- · Invest in good antivirus, anti-scam, and anti-phishing software for both your computer and cell phone. Eliminate your landline and use your cell phone exclusively after it is secured. Landlines are much harder to protect.
- Get caller ID and do not answer calls from those you don't know. They will leave a message if it is important. Do not give

out sensitive financial or medical information over the phone if you did not initiate the call. If a phone call is suspicious, just hang up.

- Register your phone number(s) at donotcall.gov, the national do not call registry.
- Do not click on links or attachments you do not recognize or from people you don't know. Check where the email/text is coming from. If you do not recognize the person or the words in the parentheses after the addressee's name, it could be a scam. The most common phishing emails/texts include:

Bills or invoices. Money always gets people's attention. They will send you an email claiming you have a past-due bill or invoice. If you do not recognize it, do not open it. Right-click on it and choose "report spam" so your email provider can act.

Account lockouts. They will send you an email claiming your account (e.g., bank account, credit card, etc.) is locked due to security issues. Do not fall for it. If you are concerned, contact the business directly and ask if there is a problem.

- Web pages. Look for https in the URL, a padlock icon (which may be either green or gray), or the words verified or secure in the address bar.
- Mail. Go to usps.com/manage/informed-delivery.htm to activate features that inform you what will be in your mail each day and when your mail has been delivered (this is a free service). When away, have the post office hold your mail. Do not send or receive checks in the mail. Instead, opt for direct deposit and use your bank's bill pay to manage your bills. For sending and receiving cash, use Zelle or Venmo.

AMATEUR RADIO



In an age dominated by smartphones and the internet, it might be surprising to learn that ham radio, a technology over a century old, continues to play a crucial role in saving lives. Amateur radio operators, often referred to as "hams," use their skills and equipment to

provide vital communication during emergencies when other systems fail.

Ham radio operators are often the unsung heroes in disaster situations. When natural disasters strike, such as hurricanes, earthquakes, or wildfires, traditional communication networks can become overloaded or completely inoperable. This is where ham radio shines. Using battery-powered radios and portable antennas, hams can establish communication links that are independent of the grid.

For instance, recently during Hurricane Helene, ham radio operators were instrumental in coordinating rescue efforts and relaying information when cell towers and internet services were down. Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) members were embedded in emergency operations centers across Florida, providing critical communications to served agencies. Their efforts ensured that emergency responders could communicate effectively, even as the storm caused widespread power outages and infrastructure damage.

There are numerous stories of ham radio operators coming to the rescue in dire situations. In one notable case during Hurricane Helene, a ham radio operator helped save a stranded family in a flooded area. The family, unable to reach emergency services through traditional means, contacted a nearby ham operator who then coordinated with local authorities to facilitate a rescue.

This is a tight-knit group of enthusiasts who are always ready to lend a hand. Many hams participate in regular training exercises and emergency preparedness drills to ensure they are ready to respond when needed. Organizations like the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) and the Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES) provide structured frameworks for hams to assist in emergencies.

Election season is approaching. We typically vote for officers at the November meeting, as December's meeting is too close to the holidays. We need to fill the following positions to keep our club running smoothly:

Use of the bocce courts is for SCA residents only.



Recently, Marcie Smedley, the executive director of the Henderson District Public Libraries. informed club members how the district is an independent special taxing one that receives no funding from the City of Henderson or Clark County.

Henderson Libraries has the lowest tax rate in southern Nevada even though the population Henderson of increased 33 percent between

fiscal year 2010 and fiscal year 2023. There are only five libraries and one mobile truck to serve this increased population. The Henderson District's board of trustees is seeking a modest tax increase to ensure the adequate operation and maintenance of library facilities, and to acquire, construct, equip and improve library facilities. If passed, the increase will be two cents per \$100 of assessed value (approximately 35 percent of the home's

value). For example, a home valued at \$400,000 would pay an additional tax of \$28.00 per year. Vote YES on Question number 1.

Karl Catarata is a candidate for the non-partisan Clark County School District Board of Trustees Seat A.

Dr. Tricia Braxton is a candidate for the State Board of Education, District 1 (corresponds to Nevada's congressional dis-

trict 1). Mr. Catarata and Dr. Braxton spoke to the club not long ago and emphasized the importance of prioritizing student success and providing educator support.

Duplicate bridge is a competitive form of bridge in which the same hands are played successively by different partnerships. In other words, a single hand of bridge is "duplicated" so it can be played a dozen or more times in a session of bridge.

Duplication of hands takes the luck of the cards out of play, thus providing fair competition. When you and your partner play a hand that is subsequently played by a dozen other pairs, the resulting range of scores represents a true picture of the relative skill of all the pairs playing that hand and "the luck of the cards" is eliminated.

Until recent history, European Jews were controlled by government decree regarding where they could live, who they could marry, and the jobs they could hold. Although some were small merchants,

they could not own their businesses or land. They dreamed of a better life – America.

Upon their arrival, Jewish immigrants were commonly employed as seamstresses, tailors, and peddlers. When David May arrived

in the mid-1860s, that work was becoming obsolete, particularly in the West. Jews found that the role of merchants provided families with economic stability and opportunities for civic leadership. They could rise from itinerant peddlers to merchants in a single generation. Many Jews, like David May and Meyer Guggenheim, went to Leadville, Colorado, where they made their fortunes.

In September, Huddleston spoke to the membership about the rising antisemitism on college campuses, and what is being done to support Jewish students.



mining town situated on the brink of the world's largest open-pit iron mine. His mother, a geologist, gained fame for developing a process for making low-grade iron ore into a valuable resource for the steel industry.

After graduation, he began his career as a civilian contract negotiator for the Navy, where his sharp negotiating skills saved millions of dollars over disputed royalties involving the purchase of large guns used on Navy warships.

During this time, computers were just starting to be adopted, and he developed one of the Navy's first spreadsheet programs. Bill would also participate in lunchtime bridge games alongside his division chief. After a decade with the Navy, he transitioned to NASA as a business policy officer. His work provided him with opportunities to meet astronauts and attend launches.

It is hard to imagine, but Bill was a race car driver. He purchased a Corvette designed for racing and drove it up and down the east coast until the engine blew out. With repairs proving too costly, he sold the car and shifted his focus to new priorities, including his family with two children.

Here are a few general tips on photographing food items. For Thanksgiving dinner, these could include anything from appetizers to desserts:

- Try to use natural light by placing plated items next to a window.
- Be sure you have arranged everything appealingly. Rotate the serving dish to find an interesting angle.
- Try taking some overhead shots or zooming in on details to fill the frame.
- If photographing table settings include the centerpiece or floral arrangement to create an atmosphere.
- Try a wide aperture (f/1.4-f/2.8) to blur the background and let in more light. To avoid "camera shake," set the camera or cellphone shutter delay for 2 seconds or longer and place the camera on a tripod or solid surface.
- When everyone gathers around the table to enjoy the feast, take photos!

Remember to ask someone to take your picture with the group or do it yourself by using a longer shutter delay and joining them.


We held a highly attended general meeting on September 30. It was a wonderful opportunity for members to come together, so-

The first item on his agenda was an exciting update to officer uniforms. Sheriff McMahill explained that the current ones are not ideal for the Las Vegas climate. In response, Metro is introducing new, lighter uniforms designed to enhance comfort and allow officers to perform their duties more efficiently. Keep an eye out for these new looks on our streets soon!

The sheriff's primary concern, however, revolves around traffic violations and accidents. With an increasing number of drivers disregarding red lights, failing to use turn signals, and neglecting speed limits, traffic safety has become a pressing issue. Sheriff McMahill emphasized that many of the accidents we see in the valley could have been avoided with more responsible driving. In light of recent events, Metro is considering the implementation of traffic cameras at high-risk intersections, a method proven effective in cities across the country to reduce violations and improve safety.

In addition to his presentation, Sheriff McMahill opened the floor for questions, addressing concerns from our members with candor and insight. We extend our sincere thanks to Sheriff McMahill for his time and valuable perspective!

The meeting also featured several candidates running for various positions, each given time to deliver brief statements to share their platforms and visions for the future.

It was a productive and engaging meeting, setting the tone for the months ahead.

It's getting cooler and we are looking forward to fall and winter adventures in our RVs.


Our members had some interesting escapades over the past few months, and we would like to share them with you.

Plants with growth requirements, tools, resources and decorations cards

One of our newer games is PLANTED: A Game of Nature & Nurture, a two- to five-player game that immerses players in the world of gardening and plant care. It combines elements of resource management and strategic decision-making with a botanical theme.

Players assume the role of gardeners, competing to cultivate the most vibrant and flourishing collection of indoor plants. Each plant requires some combination of light, water and plant food to grow. When they grow, you score points. Pretty simple.

One of the standout features of Planted is its accessibility and family-friendly design. The rules are easy to grasp, making it suitable for players of all ages, including younger children who can enjoy the colorful artwork and engaging gameplay.

Each round, players try to feed their plants with the right combination of resources. Each plant has unique requirements, and players must balance watering, fertilizing, and ensuring their plants receive enough sunlight.

Everyone starts with a handful of cards that provide resources, tools or decorations. Players draft one card and play simultaneous, so there's very little downtime. Play the card - collect resource tokens shown to care for your nursery (water drop, sun chip, plant food, green thumbs) - and pass the rest to your neighbor. Repeat until all the cards in the round have been played. Allocate those resources to your plants, score your points, and that's the end of the round.

Instead of playing a resource card, you can play a tool or decorations card. Tools help your plants thrive and provide ingame bonuses. They enhance values when specific resource cards are played; for example, an extra sun when you play a double-sun card. Decorations cards provide end-game scoring.

Planted features 42 varieties of popular and exotic houseplants, each with their own requirements to grow. The player who ends up scoring the most points from growing their plants is declared the game's biggest green thumb - and the winner!

Come to one of our club's three weekly sessions, and we'll teach you how to play PLANTED: A Game of Nature & Nurture or any of our other games. We meet in Liberty Center on Saturdays and Mondays from 1 to 5 p.m., and Thursdays starting at 5 p.m. Our dues are \$7 but come try us out for free. Come at the beginning of the session, and stay for one game, two or more! We are a collegial group that just wants to have fun, and we look forward to meeting you.
