

The Board is pleased to report that they have found several promising candidates who possess the

attributes and experience necessary to meet the community's needs. The search process has been extensive, casting a wide net to attract talent from various backgrounds. As our community matured, we are more like a small town and although we are a HOA, we also operate like a business because of our size. Looking ahead, the Board anticipates that the new General Manager is expected to start shortly after the new year. 

Holiday schedule

The Architectural Review Committee wishes everyone a safe and joyous holiday season.

During December, ARC will meet only on the second Thursday of the month. We will be dark on the fourth Thursday in observance of the holiday. Keep this in mind when submitting your architectural change applications.

All exterior modifications, upgrades, and improvements require written ARC approval prior to starting any holiday season project. We strongly encourage homeowners to review the Design Guidelines and the Rules and Regulations before submitting a request to modify their residence. You should get approval for your project before entering into a contract and placing a deposit with a contractor.

How to submit your request

To make ARC approval as painless as possible and in lieu of homeowners attending the ARC meetings, residents can email their applications and plans to ARC-Committee@scacai.com, or send them by UPS or mail, or drop them off at one of the lockboxes located outside of all our centers. To facilitate the processing of your project, we now only require one copy of your submittal; once received, it will be reviewed at the next scheduled meeting and the results will be mailed/emailed back to the homeowner.

If you are submitting plans for review, please sign and date the site plan and be available by phone during the plan review time as listed above. If you will not be available at the listed phone number, it is very important that you submit a phone number where you may be reached during this time period.

Be aware that the ARC member may be calling you from an area code other than 702, so you should answer all incoming calls during the plan review period. If you cannot be reached by phone, they will reject your project or return your submitted paperwork by mail or email with a request for further information and your project will not be revisited until the next scheduled meeting.

An ARC member will perform a final site check approximately 90 days after approval of your project to verify adherence to the approved plans.

As always you can email us at the above address or contact Community Standards with questions or concerns.

The Community Standards staff and volunteers look forward to continuing to assist the members of SCA in maintaining the aesthetics of our community.

COVENANTS

The board of directors, as required in Article 5.2 of the Bylaws, established a Deed Restriction Enforcement Committee. At Sun City Anthem, this committee is called Covenants.

The Covenants Committee is the hearing tribunal of the Association and conducts hearings pursuant to Section 3.26 of the Bylaws and Article 7.4 of the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions.

Hearings are normally scheduled once a month. Should you have any questions, please contact Compliance@SCACAI.com. A hearing is scheduled when a case cannot be resolved during the enforcement process.

The Covenants Committee hearing tribunal reviews the information regarding an alleged violation and determines whether a violation of the standards set forth in the governing documents occurred. This committee is responsible for imposing fines and/or sanctions. Following a hearing before the Covenants Committee, the alleged violator has the right to appeal the decision to the board. Covenants meetings are not open to residents unless invited.

One of the issues is that the trees planted by Del Webb over 20 years ago were, even then, marginal for the climate in the Las Vegas Valley. This includes the numerous ash, pear, plum and pine trees on our property. Consequently, many of the 2,600 trees we have in our common areas are diseased or in decline. The committee is working with the Facilities and Landscape Department to develop plans to replace the trees, as necessary.

The committee continues to look for new members, particularly those with a knowledge of or interest in landscape. The responsibilities involve attending two meetings monthly on Tuesday mornings and working on specific projects as they occur. Please consider applying if interested.


The committee's foremost concern and focus is the review and oversight of SCA's financial management, internal controls, and reporting transparency. Based on our combined knowledge and experience, we also strive to provide recommendations to the board that we believe are in the best interest of our community.

Approximately \$2.3 million in projects were undertaken in 2024, with the majority already completed. We are looking forward to January when the new Global Northstar enterprise-wide HOA information management system is up and running. This new system will provide the Association with a significantly higher level of detailed information on all the key aspects of SCA, thereby enabling more timely management of our properties, amenities, and lifestyles. Of particular interest to the committee will be the enhanced financial reporting capabilities and integration with the systems that contain detailed data on the more than 1,800 items that are evaluated annually as part of the board's requirement to determine the adequacy of SCA's reserve funds.

Volunteers are an important part of SCA's daily operations. As the complexity of SCA's needs continues to evolve, the Finance Committee could benefit by having a few additional qualified members join its ranks. Please review the background and experience requirements on the Finance Committee webpage and consider filling out a volunteer application.

The mission of the Finance Committee is to advise and assist management and the board treasurer in successfully performing their duties. The committee conducts monthly reviews of SCA finances, undertakes economic studies, and makes recommendations on financial policies and reports presented to the board of directors. The most important of these functions include a review of financial statements, annual budgets, reserve study, progress reports, and actual monthly performance to budget. Variances are discussed and recommendations are made to management and the board.

Our monthly meetings are open to the public. Residents are encouraged to attend these meetings to better understand the financial operations of the community. This is the best time and place to ask detailed questions about SCA's financial activities. Homeowner questions and constructive comments are valued, as such input provides new ideas and often identifies items that need to be addressed at future meetings.

Mandatory Age Restricted Community Survey

ederal law requires that we verify age and occupancy by reliable survey every two years to maintain our community's age-qualified status. The Federal Register explains why completing this form and providing this information is important: For a housing facility or community to qualify as housing for persons 55 years of age or older, it must be able to produce, in response to a complaint filed under this title, verification of compliance through reliable surveys and affidavits.

Homeowners must fill out one form for each property they own.

- A survey form has been mailed to all homeowners. However, we encourage you to complete the form electronically on the SCA website at SCA-HOA.org. Look for the banner at the top of the "welcome" page.
- You can download, print, or fill out the form and submit it online.
- Instructions for filling out and returning the survey mailed to you are on the back of the form.
- The homeowner or an occupant of the property who is age 19 or older can complete and sign the form after listing all occupants accordingly.
- Additional forms are available at the Membership and Fitness desks in Anthem Center, as well as at the check-in desks at Independence and Liberty Centers. Alternatively, you can request more forms at Survey@scacai.com. It is okay to make copies of the survey form.

We must verify that a minimum of 80 percent of SCA homes are occupied by at least one person aged 55+. If we fail to verify the federally required percentage on the first attempt, we will follow up by sending a second survey to those who did not respond.

Emergency Preparedness (EPSG)

Takeaways from Recent Events



ecent events continue to emphasize the need for emergency preparation. Hurricane Helene impacted the southeastern United States with devastating results. Closer to home, lithium battery spills temporarily closed I-15 and US-95 highways, disrupting commercial traffic.

Many foods and supplies are not produced locally, meaning they must be transported in, effectively turning Las Vegas into a landlocked island. Any disruptions to deliveries could result in the depletion of local resources. It is important to know that there are no local or SCA stockpiles of food and supplies, highlighting the importance of individual preparation.

Potential disruptive events include:

- Earthquakes (Las Vegas sits on seven faults).
- Extreme heat and severe cold weather.
- Hurricane force winds, flooding, and landslides (as many villages have hillsides or retaining walls).
- Hazardous materials that are either stored in Las Vegas or transported through the city by train or truck.
- Terrorism by direct attacks or cyberattacks.
- Power and gas outages caused by human activity or natural events.



Do you have an emergency kit? Having one is an important part of emergency preparedness. If you're interested in learning how to assemble a kit or enhance your current one with easy, simple steps, be sure to check back for monthly tips starting in January.



What measures can you take ahead of time?

Familiarize yourself in advance with our hazards, alerts, warning systems, evacuation routes, and sheltering plans. Below are some of the alerts you can subscribe to receive. For more detailed information, refer to the June 2023 EPSG Spirit article as well as others on our website at scaepsg.org.

Ready.gov has hazard information sheets that summarize actions you can take to prepare for, keep safe during, and recover from various disasters or hazards. You can find these resources at ready.gov/be-informed.

- Consider personal essential components of your disaster preparedness and supplies. Address specific needs, including medicines and disabilities, for yourself and people you know. Helpful tip: Instant cold packs may help keep refrigerated medications cool until a more permanent solution is found.
- Obtain the skills to evaluate the situation, obtain necessary supplies, and be mentally prepared to quickly take action to protect yourself and your family.
- Have, practice, and communicate a family disaster plan. Practicing your plan ensures you are well-prepared to respond effectively in a crisis and will also help you identify any gaps in your plan.
- Assemble an emergency kit with supplies in multiple locations (home, work, vehicle, and when traveling). Include appropriate clothing and food.
- Reduce the impact of hazards through mitigation practices.
- Change smoke and carbon monoxide detector batteries annually and test. Know the different types of beeps from smoke (three) and carbon monoxide (four) detectors that can indicate different alerts. It is recommended that all smoke alarms be replaced when they are 10 years old or if they fail to respond during testing.

The mission of the Community Service Committee (CSC) is to provide limited home maintenance, delivery of durable medical equipment for short-term loan, transportation services, external resources contact information, and support groups to assist residents to maintain their independence and to live in their own homes for as long as possible.



How Can We Help You?

Residents can request CSC's services by using our website, **CSCHelp4U.org**, seven days a week, or by calling our Assistance Line, **(702) 614-5862. Clearly state** your telephone number when leaving messages on CSC's Assistance Line and ensure availability for CSC to leave messages on your answering machine. As a reminder, your SCA Activity Card number will be needed to request services.

- Our Medical Equipment team maintains and delivers durable medical equipment for short-term loan including canes, crutches, wheelchairs, walkers, shower chairs, and more.
- The Home Maintenance team performs certain tasks that residents may not be able to safely do themselves, such as replacing batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms, light bulbs, house address bulbs, HVAC filters, adding salt to water softeners, and lubricating garage doors.
- CSC's Transportation team provides, with certain parameters, rides locally to healthcare appointments, pharmacies, grocery stores, and all SCA community centers.
- **Support Groups** provide residents and their families and friends with a forum to share individual experiences, concerns, challenges, and successes. Check the SCA weekly **Community Chronicles** eBlast for dates, times, and locations.
- Our *Communications* team maintains the Assistance Line and connects residents and their requests with the appropriate service and/or support groups.
- **Resources** maintains a list of a variety of fee-based service vendors and their contact information. CSC does not recommend or endorse any business, person, or service.
- The *Public Relations* role focuses on informing you of CSC's activities through SCA's weekly *Community Chronicles*, monthly *Spirit*, and via collateral materials, such as brochures, pamphlets, and fliers.


Member of the Month

Throughout the address, Mayor Romero reflected on the progress made in the city's five strategic priority areas and next-level initiatives. Below are key highlights for each of these areas.

Community safety

Henderson is already acknowledged as one of the safest cities in America, and efforts are underway to take community safety to the next level.

- The city built a new state-of-the-art internationally accredited forensic laboratory. It features the latest industry technology for three separate labs including latent print, toxicology, and controlled substances.
- The Henderson Police Department West station opened last fall with successful recruitment to expand operations.
- Fire Station 81 will be relocated from Horizon Drive to the old Camping World site at 1600 S. Boulder Highway. This new location is to reduce response times.
- The city's fire department is the first in the state to implement a new, lifesaving technology (cooling pods) to assist victims of heat stroke.

• First responders' access to automated external defibrillators (AEDs) has been expanded through obtaining a grant for Henderson's Police Department to assist with cardiac survivability.

Economic vitality

Henderson values quality construction and development, and the building process is a priority for the city.

- In the last five years, the Economic Development and Tourism team has assisted 36 companies in their move and expansion to Henderson and created more than 5,000 jobs.
- In 2024, the city established the Building and Fire Safety Division and the Development Services Center as separate departments. This has contributed to the development services center operating under greater efficiencies (e.g., a 30 percent reduction of turnaround time on permits).
- The Henderson Small Business Assistance Program was launched in partnership with the College of Southern Nevada's Grow program. This initiative will provide up to 12 months of technical assistance to underserved, entrepreneurial Henderson business owners.

Quality education

Mayor Romero spoke about the importance of early childhood learning and measures to improve school choices.

- The city of Henderson successfully advocated for legislation allowing cities to become charter school authorizers. This approval will mean more responsive and educational opportunities for students.
- The city is investing more than \$15 million to build a second preschool to open by 2027.

Healthy, livable, sustainable city

This priority aims to create thriving communities for today and tomorrow.

- Four new parks were added in the past year and four more are planned to open in 2025.
- Great strides in water conservation thanks to efforts to adopt a communitywide watering schedule and the only state mandating the removal of all nonfunctional turf.
- New healthcare service options were welcomed this year, including the PAM Health Rehabilitation Hospital of Henderson, Sunrise Hospital's ER at Boulder's Edge, and the Valley Health System's ER at Cadence. West Henderson Hospital is scheduled to open by year's end.

High-performing public service

The city's vision is "to be America's premier community" by focusing on strategies and approaches that improve organizational performance.

- Henderson's budget is balanced and prioritizes fiscal sustainability.
- The human resources team has focused on maintaining competitive wages to attract and retain a premier workforce, ensuring the delivery of essential services to the community.

The city of Henderson is one of only nine finalists in the nation being considered for the 2024 Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award. This is the highest level of national recognition a U.S. organization can receive for performance excellence, particularly in terms of resilience and long-term success. Recognition is based on the Baldrige criteria which is organized into categories including: (1) leadership; (2) strategy; (3) customers; (4) measurement, analysis, and knowledge management; (5) workforce; (6) operations; and (7) results.

As 2024 draws to a close, it is a wonderful time to reflect on the accomplishments of the Arts and Crafts Club. Our membership is on the rise, currently boasting over 360 members who enjoy 16 special interest groups (SIGs). The leadership team, led by president Mary Ann Thyken for the last two years, has diligently worked to meet members' needs. Their efforts aim to create a safe and well-equipped environment where members can fully engage in their creative pursuits and friendships.

Two orientation sessions were held this year to assist members with navigating the club and all it has to offer. We now have a card scanner for entry into the classroom that helps objectively measure the utilization of the room. In the first three quarters of 2024, there were more than 5,000 member visits.

New equipment has been purchased such as a light table, furniture, and chairs. New kiln lids were installed, lockers were repaired, and the room was revitalized with fresh paint and signage. Scrapbooking and similar activities had significant growth, so an additional die cutting machine was purchased.

The leadership team revised the club's charter to better reflect evolving interests. Their roles were better defined by job descriptions and associated procedures were created to help govern them. Club policies were all updated and a comprehensive safety manual was written as well as reference and resource guides for group leaders and members.

Display cabinets were consolidated at Independence Center, where 36 active sellers of greeting cards jewelry, knit/crochet items, fused glass, polymer clay, needlecraft, and artwork have generated over \$5,600 in gross sales. This has resulted in more than \$550 in net proceeds for the club. If you have not taken a stroll by these cabinets, you are missing a wonderful display of handcrafted items from our community's artisans.

Duplicate bridge is a competitive form of bridge in which the same hands are played successively by different partnerships. In other words, a single hand of bridge is "duplicated" so it can be played a dozen or more times in a session of bridge.

Duplication of hands takes the luck of the cards out of play, thus providing fair competition. When you and your partner play a hand that is subsequently played by a dozen other pairs, the resulting range of scores represents a true picture of the relative skill of all the pairs playing that hand and "the luck of the cards" is eliminated.

Jewish Tidbits -

What is Chanukah (Hannukah)?

The story of Chanukah began in 167 B.C.E. when Jerusalem was ruled by the Greek Empire. King Antiochus IV forced the Jews to renounce their religion and to worship the Greek gods in their own Temple, which had been desecrated. This resulted in a revolt by the Jews, led by Judas Maccabeus. The Maccabee army forced Antiochus IV out of Judea, reclaimed the Temple, and rebuilt the altar. When the altar was completed, the rededication included relighting the menorah — a candelabra. The soldiers only had enough oil to light the menorah for a single night, but that little bit of oil lasted for eight full nights — thus the Miracle of Chanukah. That is why Chanukah lasts for eight nights and is referred to as the Festival of Lights.

This holiday season, Chanukah will be celebrated in two different months and two different years! It begins on December 25 and ends on January 2.

HIKING AND OUTING



One of our Hiking Club members, Karen Gibson, embarked on an extensive hike this summer, and we wanted to share some highlights with you.

Karen took on the historic Camino de Santiago, a renowned pilgrimage route leading to the shrine of the apostle Saint James the Great in the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Galicia, Spain. For over a thousand years, pilgrims have walked this famous path, known for its scenic landscapes, rich cultural heritage, and spiritual significance, attracting people from all over the world.

100 km to go

Why do people embark on this journey? The reasons vary from spiritual growth and physical challenges to a break from daily life and a chance to meet fellow travelers. With multiple routes available, each one offering unique history and spectacular sights, Karen chose the Camino Francés (French Way).

Starting in Saint-Jean-Pied-de-Port on the French side of the Pyrenees, Karen stopped by the chamber office to pick up her stamp book and Camino shell. The shell clipped to her backpack, marked her as a pilgrim, and she collected stamps along the route. Covering 500 miles on foot, she completed her journey in 38 days!

Preparation and planning were key to Karen's adventure, including careful consideration of what to bring: sleeping essentials, laundry items, weather gear, snacks, and personal care. Carrying everything in her pack, she navigated Spain by watching for the distinctive yellow scallop shells that have marked the route for centuries.

The journey experience. Along the way, Karen stayed in albergues (like hostels) located in towns and villages along the route. These welcoming places often provided group meals, beds, and showers for pilgrims. Her favorite part of the journey was sharing life experiences with people from around

the world, enjoying communal meals, and embracing the long, contemplative walks alone on the trail. She met a diverse range of people, from their early 20s to their 80s, including both Camino veterans and first-timers.

Among the many route markers, the one indicating 100 kilometers left to go held special significance for Karen, as it was there, she felt confident she would finish the journey. Upon reaching the final stop in Santiago de Compostela, she was thrilled to receive her certificate of completion and final stamp.

Challenges on the trail. The terrain varied daily, from rocky paths to narrow roadways, though vehicles were rarely an issue on the route. Karen's biggest challenge was navigating the rocky sections in her trail running shoes. Next time, she says, she would opt for hiking boots.

Memorable moments. Karen's favorite memories include her arrival in Santiago and the days that followed, including meeting friends, attending Mass, witnessing the swinging of the giant incense burner (Botafumeiro), and leaving a memorable stone in the cathedral. She describes letting go of the past and embracing the Camino, where she learned the true beauty of living in the moment.



General tips

- The best time to take photos of outdoor holiday lights is between sunset and darkness. Regardless of whether indoors or out, be careful not to capture your reflection in shiny objects.
- Shoot in manual mode or aperture priority. Start with a shutter speed of 1/60 sec. and use the widest possible aperture (about f/2.8) with an ISO of at least 400. If the results are too dark, use a faster shutter speed. Experiment with your settings and composition. You do not need to fill the frame with decorations.
- When using a cellphone to photograph outdoor lighting use a night mode and turn your flash off. If possible, use a tripod, or place your cellphone on a stable object so your image will be sharp and clear. Use slow exposure and consider holding the camera horizontally.



Andy is also working with local governments — counties, cities, and school boards — to create similar financial transparency sites

that reflect the needs of each of these organizations. His message was clear: taxpayers have the right to know exactly where their money goes, ensuring government accountability at every level.




